

## MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear people of 2020,

Virtual streaming or "live" have become the watchwords of our time. Or is it "social distancing", that make these efforts necessary that is the true watchword. Social distancing seems to oppose everything about the incarnation, about our church, about the sacraments, the very coming into the world of our Lord to touch and heal people. And yet our medical reason preaches that it is necessary to preserve life. It is an act of love of neighbor.

And so we are experimenting with live streaming. I have been surprised at how easy it is to record, but how hard to really reach out to the whole "assembly", to gather the people for the sacrifice of the Mass. The Vatican directives clearly have encouraged its use, but equally clearly discouraged "recording" the Mass. What is the difference? Truthfully, I feel inspired in my offering of the Mass to imagine the parishioners participating in their "home" church, the domestic church. I think this is the difference, our Lord is really present in the moment, less so in the recorded images and sounds. To hear the "and with your spirit" in my mind makes the offering of the Mass so much more fulfilling.

I say it is easy, but to do it well, without musicians, especially, is difficult. I think Bishop Barron does it extremely well and easily accessible at Word on Fire.org. An embedded link is provided on our Home web page at Meadecocatholic.org and for Bishop John's daily Mass, as well. But, I still feel is most real and most meaningful if I can "gather" with you, and offer with you, the sacrifice of the Mass.

Therefore, beginning on this Sunday, the 5th Sunday of Easter, I will live stream the Sunday Mass at 11:00 am in English and 1:30 PM in Spanish on Facebook. . As always, I am available at all of the previously scheduled Mass times at all three locations for confessions and then will celebrate the "private" Mass, respecting the guidelines of no more than 5 people present and the six foot distance from others. Bulletins are continued to be produced weekly and placed in the entryway with copies of the Station of the Cross devotionals for private visits to the Church.

Finally, I am working on finding ways to simplify your tithing donations that participate in the sacrifice offered by our parishes, what has been called a "virtual" offertory. One training video suggested appointing a virtual usher. On-line giving and a place to drop envelopes is our desire. Thankfully, Fowler State Bank, Meade State Bank, and Plains State Bank have all agreed to receive donation envelopes and checks at their drive-up windows and night deposit boxes. Personally, I have set up automatic monthly payments through my bank. Please, continue your financial support of the Church and the Building projects.

Thank you for your faithfulness in this "strange" and "unprecedented" time in which we live. Let us join in prayer through the means of modern media and internet communication..

During this time of "social distancing", our efforts are being applied to use more effectively the social media available to us to pray together and avoid experiencing spiritual isolation in the time of physical isolation. On the Podbean app, I will publish daily my celebration of the mass through my podcast, "The frjim Podcast", which will include my daily and Sunday homily during this time that I am obligated to offer only in a private celebration of the Eucharist. The recording will also be placed on the www. meadecocatholic.org web site under the Liturgy-Homily tab. Our parishes will continue to receive a weekly bulletin that will be available on Sunday in the Church. The Church Buildings will remain open during the day and private visits are encouraged, though the rule of thumb, is no more than 5 persons together at one time. Please continue to give as you are able to support the needs of the parishes and the Building Projects. Personally, I have set up monthly automatic giving through my bank. Fr.
