If you are a Facebook member, go to Facebook “Catholic Churches of Meade County” to receive daily live streaming of the Eucharist with Fr. Jim and other special messages and services. If you can drop by the Church to pray, please pick up the bulletin and Southwest Kansas Catholic, or find the bulletin at the website. Feel free to call Fr. Jim anytime at 620-873-2003 or 620-575-5520. Confession times (only behind the screen) remain 30 minutes before live streamed masses at the same time and location they were scheduled before the stay home order. If we have a working e-mail address, we will be setting up zoom meetings on Wednesday evening and for RCIA on Tuesday evenings. Google chat is another more user friendly format for small group meetings.

### **RECONSECRATION TO MARY MOTHER OF THE CHURCH, May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020**

Archbishop Jose Gomez, president of the U.S. bishops' conference, is inviting all U.S. bishops to join him on May 1 in reconsecrating the U.S. to the Blessed Virgin Mary in response to the pandemic. The reconsecration is timed to coincide with the bishops of Canada consecrating their own country to Mary at the same time. Archbishop Gomez, who is the Archbishop of Los Angeles, said in a letter sent to all American bishops April 22, that the Marian reconsecration would be done under the title of “Mary, Mother of the Church.” He invited all the bishops of the country to join him in prayer on May 1 at 12 p.m. PDT, or 3 p.m. EDT. (2 PM Central time). “Every year, the Church seeks the special intercession of the Mother of God during the month of May. This year, we seek the assistance of Our Lady all the more earnestly as we face together the effects of the global pandemic,” he said in his letter. The

announcement follows similar plans made by the bishops of Canada, who will consecrate the Crown Dominion to Mary under the same title on the same day.

Fr. Jim will offer a prayer of consecration at 2:00 PM on Friday, May 1<sup>st</sup> via livestream at Facebook ‘Catholic Churches of Meade County’. Please join him for 20 minutes of prayer at this hour in union with the Bishops of the United States and Canada. Let us pray together for deliverance from the Covid 19 Epidemic.
