### MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear People of the Harvest,

Because of the harvest, it was suggested and I obliged that I called off the Wednesday meetings this past week. It only adds to the feeling of isolation and resistance to actively engage in our Catholic Faith. Once more, for the Gipper, as they say, I want to highlight the Pastoral Plan of the Diocese, that has been so devastatingly overwhelmed by the Covid-19 Virus. I was in the Holy Land during the priests' participation in this activity of forming a Pastoral plan, but I value the ideals that arose. The third item on the outline is "to build a community with love; Unite all in a hope-filled relationship with God.

This past weekend, I had the joy of bringing Timber and Jerilyn Woods of St. Patrick Parish, and Liana Galindo of St. John, the Baptist parish, into full communion, and look forward on the 27th at the Saturday evening of welcoming Michele Weber into the community of Catholic Faith. Frankly, I became very suspicious and uncomfortable with the "community building" efforts of the 90s that were founded in the secular writings of such as Dr. Scott Peck, the author of the famous book, The Road Less Traveled and numerous other books, and the like. They were very human concepts of forced communal efforts, like communism in some way, to build an equalitarian society that seemed to miss the absolute need for the divine to be the life force and sustaining energy of any lasting relationship with God or others.

In the recent weeks, a clarion and crystal clear voice that rang true to me was Former NFL coach Tony Dungy, the first African American head coach to win a Super Bowl. He stated and needed to state, "What happened to George Floyd was inexcusable and it should never happen, Justice needs to be served, but in seeking justice we can't fall into the trap of prejudging every police officer we see. What started out as peaceful protests have evolved into arson and looting that should never happen, either. Yes, there should be protest. But we do not have license to perform criminal acts because we're angry. Today we are a divided country. We're divided racially, politically, and socio-economically. And Satan is laughing at us because that is exactly what he wants. Dysfunction, mistrust, and hatred help this kingdom flourish." I think we all read the clarity and wisdom of this assessment, but the kicker for me was his response to his own question, "Well, what is the answer then?' Listen to this; "I believe it has to start with those of us who claim to be Christians. We have to come to the forefront and demonstrate the qualities of the One we claim to follow, Jesus Christ. We can't be silent...we must be on the forefront of meaningful dialogue and meaningful change."

The change we need is, of course, conversion to Christ and that only happens in a believing community, working, praying, playing, and planning together. We seek this hope-filled relationship with God, so beautifully symbolized, expressed, and realized in the Eucharist. We want the harvest without the work, the real harvest of love and sacrifice. Coach Dungy ended his reflection with these words, "We are fighting against Satan and his kingdom of spiritual darkness." Let us build a community of love that will withstand the test of this broken world and hope for the harvest of eternal life with God. We need everyone!
