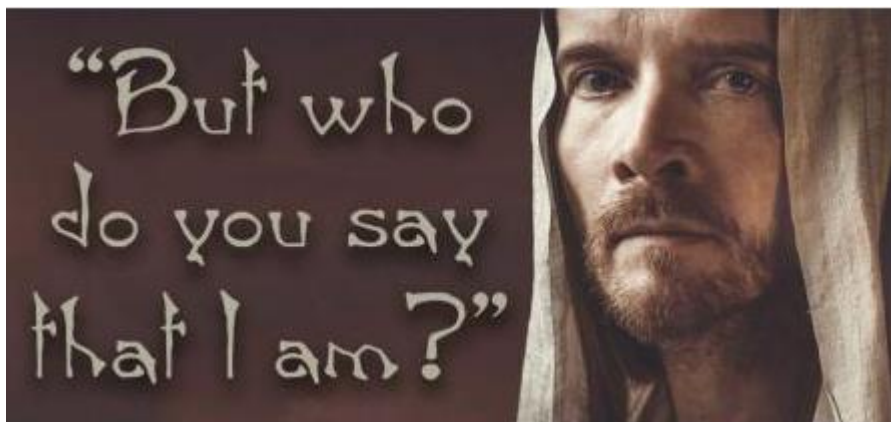

MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: I am grateful to be back in the parishes, though serving at Engaged Encounter weekends has always given me a great sense of hope that the new generation has a thriving desire to live a faith-filled life. There is a tendency to move in the direction of naming our efforts to pass on the faith, “formation” rather than “education.” This honors the wisdom of the ages that “faith is caught more than taught”. I don’t remember what many of my catechists taught me, but I surely remember their conviction and dedication to the Church.

The diocesan youth office of Gentry Heimerman and Emma Showalter has initiated an on-line initiative for youth. They are planning to begin soon on-line Bible Studies, on Monday nights for college students and on Thursday nights with high school students. I don’t know how you voluntarily get youth to participate, if you give the option to students to go to Mass or go to religious formation, the majority will choose to not go, just as a self-assertion of will. My efforts this summer to provide access to the Benedictine youth conference on line yielded exactly zero participants, though the format and presentations were excellent. Maybe, I was the one who needed to hear them. But back to the idea and opportunity of an on-line Catholic Bible study for youth, knowing that we live in the Bible Belt, where Protestant practices and beliefs dominate, it is exciting to be able to provide an opportunity for our youth to know and love our Catholic understanding of Scripture.

I will be messaging this on our parish app, so please, parents, see that your young adults check it out. But again, our youth are not just going to land there without some encouragement, even mandate.

Gentry and Emma are young people on fire with their Catholic faith and a great desire to share it. If I offer a study, it will bore the young people to tears, but with these enthusiastic guides to a beginning love of hearing the Bible, our young people will be much more likely to catch a fire for the faith. I am the world’s worst promoter, but there are many of you who have this gift to guide the youth to fountains of living water.

In many ways, we are grasping at straws trying to find a way to form our children in the faith in the new normal of social distancing. Good choices lead to good habits, which produce virtue, which ultimately sanctifies and makes one holy in the eyes of God and human people. Please help me as we struggle into this new year of catechesis to encourage our youth to this avenue of exploration of our faith. Whether your child is very timid or very social, the social media with other Catholic teenagers is a great way to open the door to a deep abiding faith.
