MUSINGS OF FATHER JIM: Dear people under the Pandemic cloud,

The assembly of priests allowed the discernment that the planned time to remove the dispensation from the obligation to Sunday Mass will be the Feast of Pentecost, May 23rd in our diocese along with Salina. We remember that many places in the world still are not allowed to gather in public assembly in churches. It was Pentecost 2020 that, after 90 days of only private on-line celebrations of the Eucharist, we were allowed to gather, but with stringent and specific restrictions in place. These precautions have for the most part, remained in place through Easter, and only now, following the directions of the local health authorities, we are permitted to remove them to the level a pastor feels it remains safe for the faithful to gather.

The other side of the coin of the removal of the dispensation, remembering that it becomes a serious sin to not participate in Sunday Mass, except in circumstances such as health or inclement weather, we must also hope to return the ritual integrity of the Sunday Eucharist by removing as we can these restrictions and still honor the anxieties that still are present in our community of contracting the Coronavirus.

Since Christmas, in our diocese and parishes, we restored the option of receiving communion on the tongue, though I still try to disinfect my hands after giving to each person on the tongue. I announced on Divine Mercy Sunday, that masks have become optional and the responsibility and prerogative of taking this precaution belongs to you; though I will continue to wear a mask to be within 6 feet of the person receiving the Eucharist. . I have begun to allow as needed, the barriers to every other pew to come down. I have introduced and Bruce Millershaski is graciously preparing automatic holy water dispensers to provide the choice of a more sanitary way to make the holy water available from a font, which I consider a long term solution to the sanitary maintenance of the holy water distribution.

In short, rather than a “cold turkey” approach, I suggest for our parishes a gradual lessening of the precautions, until throughout the world, we have control of the Pandemic. For example, I do not see any need to remove the 6 feet reminders in the aisles, as this seems a good long term practice of approaching communion leaving the distance for adequate reverence and bowing as one approaches the Blessed Sacrament. Sanitary hand cleaner will remain available at the entrance. We will continue to disinfect the pews weekly, as we have. The only two recommendations of Bishop Vincke is to not begin giving communion of the precious blood and the sign of peace which remains an optional and debated addition to the liturgy, which means a step back for us. I will no longer invite the sign of peace, but if you feel comfortable and those receiving it feel comfortable, you are welcome to offer some respectful sign.

We want our people back to “right and just” worship of our Lord and full communion in the Lord. I plan to wait to begin the collection and offertory procession until the Feast of Pentecost, May 23rd. We have planned the confirmation of six young people on the Feast of Pentecost at the 5:30 Mass in Plains. It will be most appropriate that these six candidates for confirmation be the first to bring the bread and wine to the altar. Let us gather in the Lord and receive the Holy Spirit, Fr. Jim
