WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

NOTES FROM OUR PARISH COMMUNITY:

Welcome Home!

Last week I took a ride around Lake Winola in my pontoon boat for the first time this year. When I reached the LaRue's cottage, I started feeling very old, for I am one of the dwindling number of people who actually attended the original Saint Mary of the Lake Church, which was the LaRue's cottage. Starting in the 1950's, our family were true summer cottagers, trekking from New Jersey to Lake Winola almost every weekend from May to September. As a year round lake resident today, I remember fondly my early days as a "cottager kid."

There are several family stories about my early attendance at the original Saint Mary's when I was about 3-4 years old. Apparently, whenever the collection was taken, I had a tendency to take money out of the basket, which was a source of great humor to the adjacent Mass goers. Also, the cottage had a big front porch with steps, and another story has me taking off down the steps heading down to the lakefront during Mass. My Dad didn't like that at all. To my dismay, those stories are retold every summer as the family passes the original church on boat rides.

A few years later, the present Saint Mary of the Lake Church opened. My first memory of the new Saint Mary's is of going to confession. You see, I had just received First Holy Communion at my home parish in New Jersey, and I wanted to go to confession for the second time. But I was afraid to go to confession in a new church to a priest I didn't know. Father Nallin was the pastor, and I can recall my Mom explaining the situation to him, and I remember Father welcoming me for my second reconciliation.

Years later, our family often went to the 7:30 AM Mass at Nativity so that we could have a few more hours for work or fun before returning to New Jersey later on Sunday. On the way over to Tunkhannock, sometimes we would stop and give a ride to Miss Carpenter, an elderly Nativity parishioner who would often walk all the way to Nativity for Mass from her home, which was located on Route 92 where The Skidder Shop now stands. Her faith was an example I will never forget.

The reason I tell these stories is that both of our parishes welcome many summer parishioners each year. Whether you are a cottager at Lake Winola or Lake Carey, a river dweller on the Susquehanna, or a camper in the woods, I wanted to welcome you all home and invite you to be a member of our churches for whatever time you are here. Join us this summer for weekend or daily Mass; make a Novena to Saint Ann with us; pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy with us; eat some pierogis with us; take a chance on a basket with us; have some chicken with us; run a race with us; celebrate Founder's Day

with us, etc. I hope we can help you to develop some lifetime faith memories similar to mine. **We are your vacation church and we take that very seriously.**

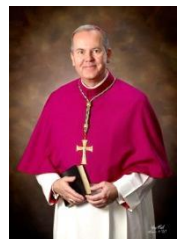

The **Feast of the Ascension of Christ** commemorates the Christian belief of the bodily **Ascension** of **Jesus** into heaven. It is one of the **ecumenical** (i.e., universally celebrated) feasts of Christian churches, ranking with the feasts of the **Passion**, of **Easter**, and **Pentecost**. Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of **Easter** (following the accounts given in **Mark 16:19**, **Luke 24:51** and **Acts 1:2**), although some Christian denominations have moved the observance to the following Sunday.

The observance of this feast is of great antiquity. **Eusebius** seems to hint at the celebration of it in the 4th century. At the beginning of the 5th century, **St. Augustine** says that it is of **Apostolic** origin, and he speaks of it in a way that shows it was the universal observance of the Church long before his time. Frequent mention of it is made in the writings of **St. John Chrysostom**, **St. Gregory of Nyssa**, and in the *Constitution of the Apostles*. The *Pilgrimage of Aetheria* speaks of the vigil of this feast and of the feast itself, as they were kept in the church built over the grotto in **Bethlehem** in which Christ is traditionally regarded as having been born. It may be that prior to the 5th century the event narrated in the Gospels was commemorated in conjunction with the feast of Easter or Pentecost. Some believe that the much-disputed forty-third decree of the **Synod of Elvira** (c. 300) condemning the practice of observing a feast on the fortieth day after Easter and neglecting to keep Pentecost on the fiftieth day implies that the proper usage of the time was to commemorate the Ascension along with Pentecost. Representations of the **mystery** are found in **diptychs** and **frescoes** dating as early as the 5th century.

In Western Christianity, the earliest possible date is April 30th (as in 1818 and 2285), the latest possible date is June 3rd (as in 1943 and 2038). **In Roman Catholicism, the Ascension of the Lord is a Holy Day of Obligation.**

REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Msgr. Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.

Sponsors must be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Confirmation, (if married) be married according to the regulations for marriage as provided by the Roman Catholic Church, officially registered and participating weekly in the Sunday Eucharist & actively striving to live out your own baptismal commitment to Christ.
