WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. FROM ST. MARY'S PARISH COMMUNITY:

Care and Give, two words we hear weekly at Mass. Care for one another, care for the poor, and so the list goes on. Give is another word used every week. Give of our wealth, time and talents. Join these two words together and they form a new word:

"CareGiver"

For each caregiver there is a unique story to tell; I can only relate mine. Two stories actually, I had the honor to care for my father at the end of his life; he was a minimal care needer. He took care of himself for the most part. Small tasks like meals or a drink of something. He enjoyed taking a ride and getting out of the house. His biggest need was company; he enjoyed talking.

The care of my wife is total attention to her needs. It is a difficult task for me. I don't like it, and I'm not good at it. Oftentimes, feeling anger and resentment. I continue to perform these tasks to fulfill the commitment we made in our youth. I am not sure how much longer I can physically keep up with demands. I can only do my best.

This letter is not to diminish the needs of careneeder but to address the needs of caregivers.

I feel it necessary to find solitude, to create space between those in need and those who provide for these needs. My space is going out for a few hours four or five times a week. Fishing is one of my leisure activities, meeting up with the Sinkers family (Dave and DJ) for a few hours on the river, or I may just watch the river slip by. Connecting with old friends or workmates refreshes your mind and spirit. Reminiscing about old times seems to be a welcoming sport for us older folk. Jesus often sought solitude away from the demanding crowds, time to be alone with God. Look at Mark 1:35-2:23 Luke 5:15-16. Remember, God is our anchor. We can look to him for strength to perform our tasks.

Don't allow yourself to become depressed, or afflict yourself with self pity. One of the tools I use to handle the pressure of caregiving is honesty. Tell your careneeder what you can and cannot do. Tell them you need a break. Set limits on demands; an example is: "I am going to nap for an hour. Please do not disturb me unless you have an emergency". Also, give them a task: "If I sleep past my time, wake me". It gives both something to do.

Be happy and pleased with your life, family and friends. Happiness is a choice; refuse to be anything but happy. We will always have our ups and downs in this life. Look to those private times with God, those wonderful times with children, grandchildren and the good times with your friends to help you through the rough spots. Nobody gets through life alone. Remember our mission statement: "To know love, and serve the Lord and one another".
