WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning. **Our detailed bulletin can be found on our website (www.nativitystmary.org).**

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Where allowed, visits are made on a regular basis. **PLEASE NOTE:** The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

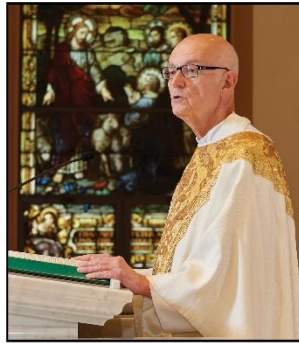

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY – OCTOBER 31ST

Parishioners in the Diocese of Scranton are invited to participate in a Pontifical Mass in celebration of World Mission Sunday next Sunday, October 31st at 12:15PM at the Cathedral of Saint Peter.

The Most Rev. Joseph C. Bambera, Bishop of Scranton, will be the principal celebrant. Father Brian J.T. Clarke, Diocesan Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies, will concelebrate. The homilist will be Father Stephen A. Asomah, Parochial Vicar, Our Lady of the Snows Parish, Clarks Summit.

Father Stephen A. Asomah was born and raised in Ghana, West Africa. He attended St. James Seminary High School and continued his seminary formation in St. Paul's Major Seminary, Sowotuum, Accra, for spirituality and philosophy and St. Peter's Regional Seminary, Pedu, Cape Coast, for theological studies. He was ordained on July 12, 2008. Prior to moving to the Diocese of Scranton in 2020, Father Stephen served in the Archdiocese of New York as a missionary from 2012-2019.

For those unable to attend the Mass in-person, CTV: Catholic Television of the Diocese of Scranton will broadcast the Mass and provide livestreaming through the Diocese of Scranton website and social media platforms.

The Pontifical Mass will follow a special collection for World Mission Sunday that is taken up annually in parishes across the Diocese of Scranton on October 23rd & 24th. The World Mission Sunday collection supports the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which supports the work and witness of the Mission Church, as it provides for priests, religious and lay leaders who offer the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities. In his message for World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis said compassion and a constant effort to reach out to others are essential elements of being "missionary disciples," even in the midst of a pandemic.

"In these days of pandemic, when there is a temptation to disguise and justify indifference and apathy in the name of healthy social distancing, there is urgent need for the mission of compassion, which can make that necessary distancing an opportunity for encounter, care and promotion," Pope Francis wrote.

The theme chosen for the 2021 celebration is taken from the Acts of the Apostles: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard."

A WELCOMING COMMUNITY: *You enter our church ... not as stranger, but as a guest of God. He is your heavenly Father. Come, then, with joy in your heart and thanks on your lips into His presence, offering Him your love and service. Be grateful to the strong and loyal ones who, in the name of Jesus Christ, built this place of worship, and to all who have beautified it and hallowed it with their prayers and praise.*

DIOCESE OF SCRANTON SYNOD EFFORT BEGAN OCTOBER 17

Pope Francis wants to hear your thoughts and dreams about the Catholic Church. The Holy Father is inviting Catholics who are already involved in church life – as well as those who may be on the margins or who have left the church – to voice their ideas and concerns about issues that are important to the Catholic Church today. The pope is calling for the church to practice "synodality," that is listening to – and hearing – one another in all facets of church life.

The process launched October 17th in dioceses worldwide. On October 10th, Pope Francis celebrated Mass in Saint Peter's Basilica to officially open the 2023 Synod of Bishops preparatory phase. The Diocesan Mass on October 17th began a local listening process in the Diocese of Scranton that will take place over the next six months.

"Through a process of careful listening, our participation in the synod process will enable us to better understand how the Christian community participates in the life of our Church in the Diocese of Scranton today and how that shared participation among our members might grow in the future," Bishop Bambera wrote in a letter to the faithful earlier this month.

The Diocese of Scranton is still in the process of developing a broad consultation process that will utilize parishes, schools and other diocesan structures. While some of the listening opportunities will be conducted in-person, there will also be an online opportunity to reach all members of the community in the Diocese of Scranton.

Through this process, Pope Francis is calling all Catholics to look more deeply into how we are all "journeying together" as a church and where the Holy Spirit is calling us. "The calling of this synod is well-aligned with the challenge Pope Francis offered his brother bishops to 'dialogue fearlessly,'" according to a document provided to local dioceses by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. "The Holy Father has made a request of the people of God to participate as fully and authentically as possible in the synodal process."

More details on how individuals in the Diocese of Scranton can participate and make their voice heard will be released in the coming weeks. *The Catholic Light* will continue to provide coverage of the opportunities that are available to the faithful.

**DIOCESE OF SCRANTON
REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR**

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations.

In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551.

**INDEPENDENT AUDIT: DIOCESE OF SCRANTON IN
FULL COMPLIANCE WITH CHILD PROTECTION
GUIDELINES**

The Diocese of Scranton has once again been found to be in full compliance with U.S. bishops' policies to prevent sexual abuse of children by clergy and other church personnel.

The Diocese has passed independent audits of its child protection procedures every year since the policy was adopted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in 2002.

The USCCB spells out the policies that dioceses must follow in its "Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People." The Charter is a comprehensive action plan for addressing allegations of sexual abuse of minors by Catholic clergy. It also includes guidelines for reconciliation, healing, accountability and prevention of future acts of abuse.

The audit was conducted by StoneBridge Business Partners, a private auditing firm based in New York, which has been contracted to conduct compliance audits of the nation's 195 dioceses.

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS AND THE LAW

You have rights as a voter protected by both federal and Pennsylvania law.

It is illegal for any state or local government to discriminate against anyone by denying them the right to vote based on their:

- race,
- ethnicity,
- national origin, or
- membership in a language minority.

Your right to vote can only be challenged if a poll worker, [poll watcher](#), or another voter says you do not live in the precinct or are not who you say you are.

It is illegal for any person or corporation to [intimidate](#) or coerce you to vote for or against a particular candidate or political issue.

There are also laws that:

- protect people in language minority groups from discrimination,
- ensure that people with a disability or the elderly can vote independently and privately, and
- establish rights for people who are in jail or who have been convicted of a crime.

Pennsylvania's new voting system initiative enabled the Department of State and Pennsylvania counties to begin piloting a cutting-edge security measure – [the risk-limiting audit](#). This "smart" audit is scientifically designed to check the accuracy of election outcomes and is new to Pennsylvania and much of the country.

A [Washington Post](#) editorial lauded the commonwealth for adopting this "no-brainer" advance in election security. "Pennsylvania is only able to start testing risk-limiting audits now because it is transitioning to paper from all-electronic systems. This represents another encouraging trend," the editorial noted.

County election officials, Department of State staff and election experts from the U.S. Election Assistance Commission, the University of Michigan, the Brennan Center for Justice at NYU School of Law, the Democracy Fund, VotingWorks, and Verified Voting participated in developing and implementing the pilot audit process using the new paper-based voting systems.

These pilots demonstrated how a risk-limiting audit **can be used to provide a high level of confidence and statistical verification** that the outcome of an election is accurate. By 2022, all counties will be conducting post-election audits that exceed the current requirements set in the state's Election Code.

WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS FOR VOTING IN THIS ELECTION?

1. All registered PA voters can cast their ballot by mail.

- Apply online today at [vote.pa.gov](#).
- Applications are available in multiple languages, including English, Spanish, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, and Vietnamese.
- You do not need an excuse to apply for a mail-in ballot.

2. Vote at your county election office.

Once your county's ballots are finalized and printed, you can go to your county election office, apply for a mail ballot, vote your ballot, and submit your ballot in the same visit.

3. Vote in person at your polling place on Election Day.

STATEMENT OF PA CATHOLIC BISHOPS REGARDING SAFETY AND MASS ATTENDANCE

- Sick
- Have a serious health risk
- In a household with those at risk
- Primary caregivers to those at risk
- Have serious anxiety or concerns about being in a large-group setting due to COVID-19
- Unable to attend Mass in person

As an act of charity, anyone who believes they might have COVID-19 or one of its variants should stay home.
