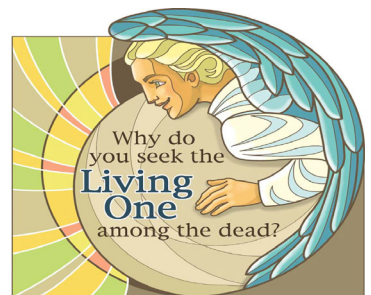

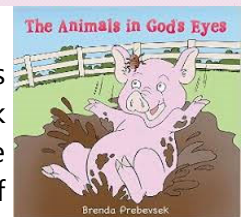
NEW PARISH MINISTRY: "Run/Walk for God"

In Math class the sixth graders have been busy learning how to apply their knowledge of rational numbers to locate and graph points and polygons on a coordinate plane. Activities listed on the google classroom page have helped them to practice this skill. They have created different types of polygons and have then reflected and translated them to different spots on the coordinate plane. They are learning how to define functions and to recognize them in different forms like tables, graphs, and equations.

The fifth graders have been studying multiplication and division of fractions. They are applying this knowledge to creating and completing real world problems involving multiplying and dividing fractions. They are learning to reason abstractly and make sense of word problems to solve them correctly. Each week they have an interactive problem solving activity on their chrome books which allows them to solve a problem and then interact with a classmate to leave a comment about their solution of a problem.
