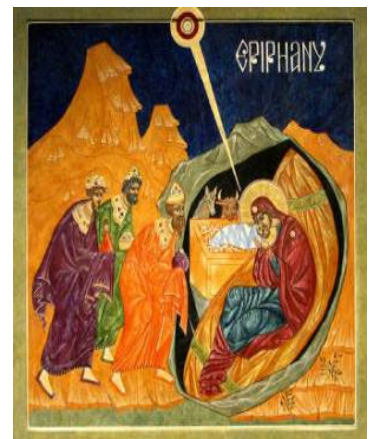

Dear Parishioners,

As we come to the end of the Christmas season, I want to thank all of those who donated for our Christmas flowers and décor. Thank you so much! We will list the names of those honored and memorialized in the January 15 bulletin. Every year I am amazed at how beautiful the Church looks. It is a sacred place where we can feel comfortable and loved in our encounter with Christ in the Sacraments.



Today is also our annual Epiphany and Parish Anniversary Concert. Thank you so much to Kyle Lorek and all our musicians for providing such a great way to end our Christmas season and celebrate our Parish Anniversary.

It is so hard to believe that this is the 7th anniversary of the founding of the parish. In many ways it seems like just yesterday we began this journey of building a new parish. It has been a unique and privileged endeavor for all of us. On January 3, 2010, the feast of the Epiphany, at our opening Mass with Bishop Pevec, I presented the challenge for the parish to help ALL find Jesus Christ under our star here at 367 E. 260th Street. I can say with complete certainty that we have, and will continue, to accomplish this goal. Certainly we have had our challenges, and sometimes even stumbled, but we have always been able to rise to the occasion and move our community forward. To this day, many people throughout our Diocese marvel at what an active, vibrant parish community we are here in Euclid. All of this is only possible because of you and your dedication to our parish. So, thank you! I am honored and privileged to be a part of the wonderful things that happen here everyday!

As we look to our next year together as a parish community, I see some exciting new things happening:

- ◆ **The Alpha Program** we are starting what will hopefully be a great evangelization tool to help bring more people to be a part of our parish and more importantly the Catholic Faith. There are so many people searching and desiring a relationship with Jesus Christ, and this may help them in their endeavor. This 10-week course introduces them to Jesus Christ and his Church—the people of God.
- ◆ **A focus on the Baby Boomer and Generation X parishioners (born between 1946—1976)** will be very exciting since I am a part of that generation! These two generations have so much to offer the parish, and I hope to find ways to engage them more in the life of the parish. Our first event is a social outing at *Great Scott Tavern* on February 3. Check elsewhere in the bulletin for more information.
- ◆ **We will be revamping our Confirmation preparation program.** While we will continue to have Confirmation in the 8th grade year, the Diocese has recently revamped the preparation requirements. To address this we will begin in the 7th grade year and the preparation will last for two years. I think this will help to actively engage our young people and connect them a bit more to their faith.
- ◆ **Our school will be working towards a STEM designation.** STEM is a focus on helping the students use critical thinking to sharpen their problem-solving skills. It focuses highly on collaboration with local businesses and industries in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. This will help prepare them for jobs of the future. **We will also be working towards a Step up to Quality star rating for our preschool program.** This will help us access some additional funding and resources for our preschool program.

Some exciting things are in our future! As always we will continue to focus on celebrating Mass the best way we can and keeping it at the center of all we do!

We continue our series in which each staff member of the school reflects on his/her mission and purpose of Catholic Education. Meet Mrs. Jessica Hudec. She has a 4th Grade homeroom and teaches Reading to students in Grades 4 and 6. Here is Mrs. Hudec's mission and the beliefs she holds dear:

The mission for room 213 is for the teacher and students to come together as a team to create a safe, loving, joyful environment where everyone can learn, grow, and succeed. **The beliefs behind this mission:** I believe that every student has the right to learn in a safe environment. When a student feels safe physically, emotionally, and psychologically, he/she is more likely to be open to exploring new ideas and trying new things. To create this environment, the teacher and students will work together on effective communication strategies. By emphasizing communication, students will learn to understand each other's boundaries and limits as well as how to resolve conflict. Having a safe, open communication environment will help me recognize situations when a student doesn't feel safe and allow me to quickly step in and help that student resolve the situation. Creating a safe environment is a team effort. We must be all-in in respecting and loving one another for everyone to feel safe. I believe that a joyful environment helps students to learn and succeed. Students perform best when they are welcomed in the classroom and excited every morning to come to school. To create a joyful environment, this year room 213 will have a Happiness Wall where students can share their work, drawings, or found items that make them feel happy. As we get to know each other, I hope that as a team we can create and implement other projects which will allow all of us to take ownership in the joy in our classroom. I believe that everyone learns best when he/she is in a loving environment. The teacher and students must all work together to follow the school's mission of loving one another. To do this, we will spend time getting to know each other and share with each other each week. Some of the ways we will do this is to learn and sing a class theme song, participate in Morning Meetings, and share events on our Happiness Wall. We will also incorporate the lessons the students learn during their Christian Living classes into our everyday routines. A loving environment depends on the whole team working together to show love as Jesus taught us.
