Masks will be required at all times (with the exceptions for small children, at the judgement of their parents, and of those for whom health reasons preclude them from wearing them), except when you are about to receive the Eucharist. In order to avoid having parishioners cross through the pews in the middle of the Mass & have to remove their masks to consume the Eucharist, Fr. Rich will consecrate the Host as he normally would, but you would not receive the Eucharist until you are departing Mass at the end. He will be at the back of the church behind a plexiglass partition (for your safety as well as his), and he will be able to give you the Eucharist at that time in the hand.

We will not be able to have hymnals or the prayer cards at Mass. If you want to follow along, you can pull up the readings online on your smartphone (for example, on the USCCB website). We also ask per the guidance of the Diocese, that we don't sing during Mass. At Masses where there is music, only the cantor may sing. We will not be able to have any Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, or Altar Servers at Masses right away.

For the time being, we ask all parishioners to please use the entrance on the handicap ramp to enter the church, remaining 6 feet apart from people that are not in your household. Upon entering the church, you'll be directed as to where you or your family should sit as we've marked the specific areas where seating is allowed. A great deal of planning has gone into how to best accommodate as many people as safely as possible. When Mass is over, you'll be directed toward the back of the church by section, again, keeping a 6 foot buffer from anyone not in your household. As you depart by the main entrance at the back of the church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist (or a blessing) from Fr. Rich. You are able to go right out the doors there, or, if you need the ramp, you are most welcome to exit that way.

We have limited seating available at Mass for the time being in order to insure the 6-foot social distancing. Because of COVID-19 and the Mass limitations, there is still a dispensation for all Catholics from your obligation to attend Mass. We encourage those who fall in the high risk categories (over 65 and anyone with underlying health issues or anyone who is concerned about taking a chance with their health or the health of those in their household) to consider watching the live-streamed Masses that we will still be offering, or, perhaps go to one of the Masses during the week. If you are experiencing any symptoms of illness (fever, cough, etc.), please do NOT come to Mass. **Mass reservations** are required at this time so that we can accommodate as many people as possible at each Mass. We are limited to approximately 40 people at the church and about 55 at the Parish Center. By doing reservations, we can insure that we will have a seat for everyone attending the Mass. Additionally, the state does require us to get the name and phone # of anyone attending Mass should they need to trace a case of COVID-19.

If you wish to have anonymity, simply drive up behind him and you can stay in your car if you'd like (or you can walk up behind him. He won't turn around). If you prefer, you can bring a chair and have a face to face confession, or you can also take a walk around the parking lot with Father. The choice is yours. Again, the times will vary, based on his schedule, but we will post them on our Facebook page and the website and if time permits, the bulletin. This week the schedule will be:

Thanksgiving to God after Holy Communion:

We are all encouraged to thank God in prayer after we have received Him in Holy Communion. Due to the temporary practice of receiving Our Lord right as we are heading out the door of the church, it might be good to plan ahead as to when you could spend that time in prayer, thanking God for the gift of Himself. It could be:

- right after Mass, you could go over to pray near one of the statues on the church property
- or you could pray in the car, either parked or while driving (turning off the radio, unless it's tuned to music to help you pray)
- or some time in which you could pray while walking or sitting at home or someplace else

Weekly Rosary for the conversion of our country and our world: Thursdays at 7:15 pm outdoors in the rectory yard at St. Mary's in downtown Taunton (corner of Washington St. & Broadway – route 138). The Rosary will be prayed in English, Spanish & Portuguese. Please wear a mask. We will socially distance – please bring a lawn chair or something to sit or kneel on. You can also bring a candle.

Congratulations to Michael III, Avery, and Caiden Braxton on receiving the sacrament of Baptism here last weekend. Please keep them in your prayers as they grow in the great gift of faith and God's grace and live as members of the Body of Christ. Please pray for their parents and godparents that they will be the instruments they need them to be to lead them in their response to love God and their neighbors.

A reminder that next weekend is First Friday and First Saturday. On Friday, Adoration will run the regular time from 11am-8pm at the rectory window. For Saturday, Adoration will run from 10am-3pm. Please feel free to come by and spend some time with our Lord. Adoration is happening - with the "Drive-up" Adoration Monday-Friday from 11am-8pm. There are 2 driveways between the church and rectory. You may pull up in one of those driveways and either sit in your car to pray, or, on nice days, you are welcome to bring a chair from home to sit in, or you may stand, kneel, or sit on the grass to pray. We have added a tent with a couple of fans now that it's hot. We do ask that if you are not in your car, that you please maintain a social distance of 6 feet apart from anyone not in your household and that you wear a mask for your safety and the safety of others. You do not need to wear a mask if you are in your car.

We have a couple of permanent Adoration hours that need coverage at this time. If you are able to commit permanently, or even temporarily, please let Tracey know in the office. They are:
Tuesdays from 1-2pm
Tuesdays from 2-3pm
Fridays from 3-4pm

Candles in the church—Sarah can light candles for your prayer intentions if you would like to have one lit. The offering is \$3 per candle to cover the cost of the candle. If you would like one lit, please contact Tracey in the office at secretary@holyfamilytaunton.org, or 508-824-5707.

Currently the office is closed for regular business, though Tracey is still working. We have installed a mailbox outside the parish office that you may leave correspondence or budget envelopes. The mailbox is checked 2-3 times per day.

URGENT PRAYER REQUEST FOR LIFE (and the DEFEAT of The Three MA. Death Bills) AND FOR OUR NATION

We are inviting you to join in a 54 Day ROSARY NOVENA FOR LIFE, AND THE LIFE OF OUR NATION beginning September 10 and ending November 2.

Specifically we are praying for Our Blessed Mother's intercession that these **3 life threatening bills** will be defeated in the Massachusetts State House. The Judiciary and the Public Health Committees have delayed voting until November 12th. The bills are:

1. Roe Infanticide Act, Bill #H3320:

- it allows for abortion on demand at all stages of pregnancy up to and until birth;
- allows NO protection for babies born alive after a failed abortion;
- permits late term abortions to be performed outside of hospitals, thus endangering young girls and women;
- no parental consent needed for underage girls; and
- Eliminates all criminal penalties for those who perform abortions that are NOT doctors; and
- Requires taxpayers to pay for abortions.

How can your voice be heard AGAIN?

1) Contact your local Senator and Representative and let them know that you are opposed to these two bills and that you are a voter in their district.

2) Contact the members of the Joint Committee on Judiciary who will decide the fate of these bills.

2. University Abortions Bill #H3841:

This bill provides up to \$400,000 to every public college and university to provide on-campus abortions.

3. Physician Assisted Suicide, Bill H4782: This bill would allow doctors to prescribe deadly doses of drugs to patients who may be under duress who want to end their lives. This bill has already received a favorable review from the Joint Committee on Public Health.

It is vitally important that our local state representatives and senators hear from you.

The 54 Day Novena is also for our Nation. We are praying for God's will to be done in the upcoming election, for Peace on our streets and in our hearts, for health and that we would once again be One Nation Under God with Liberty and Justice for All.

We wish to implore heaven for these intentions and hope you will commit to this Rosary Novena with us. It can be downloaded from the Internet at the following website: www.54Novena.com. A Novena consists in doing the Rosary for 9 days. The 54 Day Novena is divided into two parts: praying the Rosary for 27 days in petition for Life and for the Life of Our Nation and 27 days of praying the Rosary in thanksgiving.

It takes less than 30 minutes a day and is a small sacrifice for Life and our Nation.

Background:

The 54 Day Novena Rosary originated in Pompeii Italy around 1884 when Our Lady appeared to a sick girl and her relatives who had begun a novena of rosaries for her healing. The girl called Mary, "Queen of the Holy Rosary," and asked her to be cured. Our Lady told her to make 3 Novenas and she would receive healing. She also told the girl that the title, Queen of the Holy Rosary was most precious to her. Once more the Queen of the Holy Rosary appeared to the girl and told her: "Whoever desires to obtain favors from me should make 3 novenas of the prayers of the Rosary and 3 novenas in thanksgiving." The miracle of Our Lady's appearance and the girl's healing so impressed Pope Leo XIII to urge all Christians to love and to say the Rosary.
