**Masks will be required at all times** (with the exceptions for small children, at the judgement of their parents, and of those for whom health reasons preclude them from wearing them), except when you are about to receive the Eucharist. In order to avoid having parishioners cross through the pews in the middle of the Mass & have to remove their masks to consume the Eucharist, Fr. Rich will consecrate the Host as he normally would, but you would not receive the Eucharist until you are departing Mass at the end. He will be at the back of the church behind a plexiglass partition (for your safety as well as his), and he will be able to give you the Eucharist at that time in the hand.

For the time being, we ask all parishioners to please use the entrance on the handicap ramp to enter the church, remaining 6 feet apart from people that are not in your household. Upon entering the church, you'll be directed as to where you or your family should sit as we've marked the specific areas where seating is allowed. A great deal of planning has gone into how to best accommodate as many people as safely as possible. When Mass is over, you'll be directed toward the back of the church by section, again, keeping a 6 foot buffer from anyone not in your household. As you depart by the main entrance at the back of the church, you will be able to receive the Eucharist (or a blessing) from Fr. Rich. You are able to go right out the doors there, or, if you need the ramp, you are most welcome to exit that way.

**We have limited seating available at Mass** for the time being in order to insure the 6-foot social distancing. Because of COVID-19 and the Mass limitations, there is still a dispensation for all Catholics from your obligation to attend Mass. We encourage those who fall in the high risk categories (over 65 and anyone with underlying health issues or anyone who is concerned about taking a chance with their health or the health of those in their household) to consider watching the live-streamed Masses that we will still be offering, or, perhaps go to one of the Masses during the week. If you are experiencing any symptoms of illness (fever, cough, etc.), please do NOT come to Mass. **Mass reservations** are required at this time so that we can accommodate as many people as possible at each Mass. We are limited to approximately 40 people at the church and about 55 at the Parish Center. By doing reservations, we can insure that we will have a seat for everyone attending the Mass. Additionally, the state does require us to get the name and phone # of anyone attending Mass should they need to trace a case of COVID-19.

**On Monday, November 9<sup>th</sup>**, there will be a Christmas decorating committee meeting at the church at 7pm. We will socially distance and wear masks in order to come up with our plans for this year's inside and outside decorating. Anyone that would like to join us is more than welcome!

### **Thanksgiving to God after Holy Communion:**

We are all encouraged to thank God in prayer after we have received Him in Holy Communion. Due to the temporary practice of receiving Our Lord right as we are heading out the door of the church, it might be good to plan ahead as to when you could spend that time in prayer, thanking God for the gift of Himself. It could be:

- right after Mass, you could go over to pray near one of the statues on the church property
- or you could pray in the car, either parked or while driving (turning off the radio, unless it's tuned to music to help you pray)
- or some time in which you could pray while walking or sitting at home or someplace else

### **We have weekday Mass intentions available**

for this year (October-December), as well as a few weekend Masses. If you'd like a daily Mass said in memory of a loved one, or for a special intention, please contact Tracey in the office. The offering for a Mass is \$10 for weekdays; \$20 for Saturday night & Sunday Masses.

**Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, will be beatified during a special Mass on October 31st** at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, CT. McGivney is best known for founding the Knights of Columbus in 1882—a group that has grown to become **one of the largest Catholic organizations in the world** with 2 million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia, and Europe. On May 27, the Vatican announced that Pope Francis had signed the decree recognizing a miracle through the intercession of McGivney, clearing the way for his beatification. **Said miracle was blessed upon the 13th child of the Schachle family from Dickson, Tennessee.** When Michelle Schachle found out that her 13th child not only had Down syndrome, but fetal hydrops—an uncommon, typically fatal condition where fluid builds up around the vital organs of an unborn child—**she and her husband Daniel appealed to Fr. Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, for help.** The unborn Schachle was given “no hope” - the combination of fetal hydrops and Down syndrome meant that he had no chance of survival. Asking Fr. McGivney for his intercession was a no-brainer for the Schachle family. Daniel works for the Knights of Columbus and had previously been Grand Knight of his local council. The Schachles even dubbed their homeschool the “Fr. McGivney Academy.” **Thanks to the intercession of Fr. McGivney, Michelle's unborn baby was miraculously cured of fetal hydrops, which meant he would indeed live.** When Michelle heard her child had been healed, she knew she had to name him Michael, in honor of McGivney. Today, Michael "Mikey" Schachle is a happy and active five-year-old.

### **Adoration is now INSIDE the Parish Cen-**

**ter.** Due to the limited space in the chapel (only allowing 1-2 people at a time inside under social distancing guidelines), we will have Adoration set up in classrooms 1 & 2. **Adorers will enter by the door at the front left of the building** & you will be able to access the door for the temporary chapel from there. For now, the times will still be M-F from 11am-8pm and then First Saturday Adoration will be 10am-3pm. Masks are required and there will be limits on the number of Adorers that can be in there at one time. We ask that you help us by sanitizing your chair/kneeler before you leave with the wipes/disinfectant provided. Thank you!

**Confessions are available!** Fr. Rich is out in the parking lot during designated times to hear Confessions (if it is raining or hailing, he will be on the rectory porch – and if you approach from the driveway, he won't turn around, so that you can have anonymity). In the parking lot, if you don't want him to know you, simply drive up behind him and you can stay in your car if you'd like (or you can walk up behind him. He won't turn around). If you prefer, you can bring a chair and have a face to face confession, or you can also take a walk around the parking lot with him. This week the hours will be:

**TEMPORARY ADDITIONAL MASS:** Due to the way in which several of the Masses fill up quickly online, we are temporarily adding another weekend Mass, so as to better accommodate those wishing to attend Mass. **For the month of October we will see how a Sunday 6 pm Mass (in the church)** works for being able to allow people to worship. We will continue with the other additional Mass (Saturday 7 pm at the parish center) and the other “regular” Masses (Saturday 4 pm, Sunday 7:30 & 10:30 at the church; Sunday 9 am at the parish center).

**Due to the ongoing pandemic**, this year’s Penny Sale, Century Club dinner, and Harvest Fair have been cancelled. At this time, the state does not allow more than 25 people gathered indoors together with the exception of Mass. The Finance Council came up with a solution that would also benefit a local business during this time, while still allowing our Century Club members to get an enjoyable meal and take a night off from cooking! We will be working with Stoneforge in Raynham to have a designated time/date to pick up a delicious dinner without having to get out of your car. We are working out the details right now, but all Century Club members will be notified of the change. Additionally, since we don’t have to pay for a DJ this year, we are doing an additional \$500 in raffle prizes on top of the regular raffle prizes drawn. Thank you so much for your understanding!

The state legislature has extended the session until January 5th, 2021. Please remind the members of the Joint Committee on Judiciary that you oppose the expansion of abortion in Massachusetts. Please call the Committee at 617-722- 2396 and let them know you are opposed to H3320 and S1209 – the ROE legislation.

Every telephone call helps! Remember these bills would remove:

- The requirement that young girls obtain consent before an abortion
- The requirement that efforts be made to save a living baby who survives abortion
- The requirement that late term abortions be performed in hospitals
- And the bills would allow abortion on demand for all nine months of pregnancy
