'Try Prayer! It Works! Contest' 2021 now accepting entries.

Family Rosary annual contest for young Catholics identifies a theme of Following Mother Mary's Example. Inspired by founder, Venerable Patrick Peyton, the "Try Prayer! It Works! Contest" focuses on Father Peyton's message, "The family that prays together stays together," and aims to strengthen family prayer, creating a family-faith experience that takes children and parents through a reflective, enriching journey. Try Prayer! It Works! Invites families to light a candle and pray together, and then share this year's theme as a family reflection. "Do Whatever He Tells You" (Jn 2:5), this year's theme, will help families explore how Mother Mary's example and intercessory prayer can help people follow God's will. From Mary, especially through the prayer of Rosary, participants can explore how Mary's maternal influence can lead families closer to Jesus. "We hope that families will grow closer to each other and deeper in the faith as they share this reflection experience," said Father Jim Phalan, C.S.C., National Director of Family Rosary (and an occasional celebrant of weekday Masses at Holy Family). "No matter what any of us face in life, our Blessed Mother and her Divine Son are inviting us into this glorious command of love and obedience. "Participants are invited to write about a real story from their lives about following Jesus, interview someone in their family or community about doing God's Will, create a drawing that reflects the Blessed Mother's impact on the world, or create a short family video project expressing what it means to be disciples of Jesus. Children grades K-12 enrolled in a Catholic school, Religious Education program, parish, or other organization, including home school, are eligible to enter.

All United States contest entries must be submitted by March 25. Family Rosary inspires, promotes, and fosters the prayer life and Spiritual well-being of families throughout the world. It is a member ministry of Holy Cross Family Ministries, an organization that serves families through 26 mission centers in 17 countries. The HCFM organization includes Family Rosary, Family Theater Productions, Catholic Mom, the Museum of Family Prayer, Father Peyton Family Institutes, and the Peyton Institute for Domestic Church Life. FORMED... It's that time of year again when we get a bill from FORMED to renew our annual subscription. We offer it free to all of our parishioners, accessible through our website. It has so many wonderful resources to learn and strengthen your faith. We are appealing again to anyone who may want to make a donation to help offset the \$1,999 renewal. In most of the years we've had it, we've been fortunate to have the majority of it paid for with donations. If you'd like to help, just write "FORMED" on a blank envelope and place it in one of the collection bins at the church or parish center, or mail it into the church. So far, we've received \$256 in donations toward FORMED. If you've never used this wonderful platform before, please give it a try!

Bible Study of the Sunday Readings: Father Babiczuk of Taunton Catholic North (St. Anthony, St. Jude, and St. Mary) leads an on-line Bible Study of the Sunday Readings on Tuesdays at 11:00am. We study the readings for the coming Sunday. The study involves both an explanation and discussion of the readings. Just a reminder that in order to keep Adoration going through the winter, we need your help. We ask that you wear a mask in the building at all times and when you're leaving the chapel, please be sure to wipe down your seat/kneeler with the antibacterial wipes provided. Also, we are always looking for substitutes to help out with back-up coverage, so feel free to let us know if you'd like to be added to the substitute list. We've been told that sometimes all 4 seats are taken in the chapel when one of the scheduled Adorers arrives. We have added 2 more seats in the adjacent classroom. One seat has a view of the Monstrance, while the other seat is not within view of the Eucharist, but is just beyond the wall from it. You are welcome to take one of those seats until one opens up in the temporary chapel. Adoration runs Monday-Friday from 11am-8pm and on First Saturday from 10am-3pm at the Parish Center. You may access the temporary chapel by the door to the far left when facing the Parish Center. For the time being, Merle Coughlin has offered to help Tracey with Adoration coverage, so if you haven't been able to find coverage on your own, please contact Merle for assistance. Thank you so much for your continued support and helping us keep our parish family healthy!

A Day with Mary will be held on Saturday, March 6th at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, 225 N. Front Street, New Bedford, MA. The day will begin at 8:00 am with the Procession, Mass at 9am in honor of Our Lady. Celebrant and Homilist will be Fr. C. Salach, OFM. Bring a bagged lunch for the lunch break. Silent Adoration will begin at 12:55pm. Benediction at 2:00 PM. The day ends at approximately 3:00 PM.

This coming week will be First Friday and First Saturday. Adoration on Friday will be the regular hours, from 11am-8pm in the temporary chapel at the Parish center. On First Saturday, Adoration will run from 10am-3pm. Please feel free to come by and spend some time in prayer this lent with our Lord.

Thank you to all who have donated gift cards, scratch tickets, or monetarily to the upcoming calendar fundraiser. We are still in need of gift cards and scratch tickets in order to make this fundraiser a success. As you know, our biggest fundraisers of the year had to be cancelled due to Covid. We were not able to have our Penny Sale or Harvest Fair in 2020, and chances are good that they won't be happening this year either. Overall church donations are down due to the pandemic, so we would like to have a non-contact fundraiser to help with replacing ordinary funds. If you're able to assist us with a donation, they can be dropped in the weekly collection box at church, mailed to the PO Box, or dropped off at the parish center. Again, thank you all for your continued support of our parish!

The Church calls for days of abstinence and fasting during Lent:

- Abstinence from meat on all Fridays during Lent and Good Friday for those aged 14 and older;
- Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for those aged 18 through 59. Fasting is defined as eating only one full meatless meal. Two other smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs. The total food from those 2 other meals should not exceed the total of the primary meal.

Those who are not obliged to fast or abstain from meat are encouraged to join in those disciplines to the extent that they are able. Catholics are urged to regard the Lenten season as a serious time for spiritual renewal by intensifying prayer, practicing works of piety, and seeking out opportunities for charity. For those who do not live alone, we encourage you to find some time to pray together at home – be it the Rosary or the Divine Mercy Chaplet, reading the Bible (especially the accounts of Our Lord's Passion or that day's Mass readings) out loud, or other prayers or readings.

Stations of the Cross: A Lenten custom is to pray the Stations of the Cross, meditating upon the love that Christ demonstrated for us on Good Friday. There are a few options:

- We will pray the Stations in person Fridays at 7 pm in the church. As we do for daily Mass, we will need your names and phone numbers for contact tracing, and you will need to be in the pews socially distanced by household.
- You can pray the Stations together via one of the many Stations of the Cross presentations on Catholic TV, EWTN, Catholic radio, or the internet.
- You can pray the Stations outdoors in the church parking lot.

On December 8, 2020, Pope Francis announced a Year to St. Joseph.

As a Diocese, we will be partaking in this year through opportunities for prayer and formation, including the 33 day Consecration to St. Joseph concluding May 1, the Feast of St. Joseph, the Worker.
