It's not officially "summer" for another week, but it's sure feeling like it right now! For those of us who can tolerate the heat and humidity or who have easy access to air conditioning, it's probably not much more than an inconvenience. Please be aware, though, that there are still many folks who don't handle extreme weather conditions well. They may have health conditions or minimal/no access to relief. These are opportunities for us to do corporal works of mercy: check on the elderly, the infirmed, the unemployed people in our communities; offer them help as you are able. Remember that **"whatsoever you do for the least of these, you do for Me."** (Matthew 25:40) This includes the rest of God's Creation, too, so be sure the animals are also looked after.

Something else to remember is to take care of ourselves. It is important to keep in mind that, no matter our station in life, we are all God's children. He has created each one of us with a particular mission, large or small. But He didn't just create us to work for Him - He created us to love Him, above all. Let's spend some time this summer caring for each other. Relax. Eat well. Enjoy each other's company. Breathe deeply.

FAQs about Marriage & Annulments

Can a Catholic marry a non-Catholic who has been divorced? Yes, once the non-Catholic has received an annulment. The Church believes that a person can have only one valid marriage in one's lifetime (except for death of one's spouse). The non-Catholic marriage must undergo the same review as the Catholic marriage and be declared invalid before one is allowed to marry in the Catholic Church.

How do I start the process? How long does it take? Is it very expensive? The process begins in the parish. A priest, deacon, or pastoral minister will assist you in preparing the documents that will need to be submitted to the Tribunal. The length of time varies with each case. There is no cost for an annulment.

What happens after my case is sent to the Tribunal? The Tribunal seeks to find the truth regarding the question of the validity of the marriage. The process involves contacting the former spouse, gathering written testimony from the parties and witnesses. All testimony is reviewed by Church officials trained in the areas of Canon Law, Theology, or Social Sciences. The Church judge will then issue a decision, with moral certainty, regarding the validity or invalidity of the marriage.


