 and forget about the present. But the present is the only time we can really love. It is vital to form the habit of asking the Holy Spirit to show us where he is asking us to love right now. One specific way to do that is doing ordinary things with extraordinary love. Prayer has a unique power. It may seem ordinary, but when we pray with love, its effectiveness is extraordinary. So this week, let us set aside 15 minutes to pray for someone else. We could pray a rosary for that person. We could go to daily Mass and offer it for that person. We could make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament for that person. But whatever it is, stick to it. And then let that person know that we have been praying for the person. In the Holy Eucharist, we see how practical Christ's love for us is. He laid down his life for us in an outpouring of love, and he gives us the strength to follow his example. Let us beg Jesus, really present in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, to set our hearts on fire with love, and to give us the strength to love others as he has loved us: to the end.

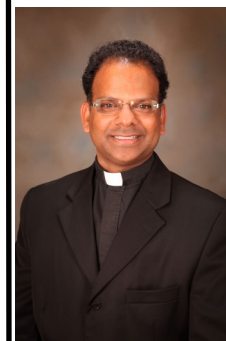

**Father Tony's Corner**



Today, we are reminded of the New Commandment that Christ gave us the day before he suffered. We are brought back to that Last Supper, when Jesus was gathered with his closest companions and opened his heart to them. It was the night when his heart overflowed with love as it never had before. It was the night when he revealed the secret identity of every Christian, and the distinguishing mark: 'I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another'.

Being a Christian is much more than being a member of a club. Being a Christian means having an urgent, important mission in life. It means being another Christ in the world. Jesus gave his very life in order to fulfill his Father's will and win salvation for sinners. Each one of us is called to reproduce in the unique circumstances of our lives that exact same pattern: dedicating our lives to discovering and fulfilling God's will, and striving to help as many people as possible know, love, and follow Christ. Sometimes we think this New Commandment is only for people who are already saints. It is not. It is the path to sanctity. Sometimes we think this commandment is too difficult to be realistic. But if it were, Christ would not have issued it. We need to make a decision. We need to decide once and for all that following Christ, striving to live as he would live if he were in our shoes, is going to be our highest priority. He can help us, teach us, strengthen us, pick us up when we fall down, and inspire us when we get discouraged - he can do all of that for us, especially through the sacraments. But there is one thing that even God cannot do for us: he cannot choose our highest priority in life, only we can do that - with the help of his grace, moving our freedom from within. Let us choose Christ; let us make the decision, once and for all. The suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus brought us back to God. It made it possible for us to receive God's love and to love him in return in a new way. So after laying this foundation, Jesus tells his friends that he will only be with them a little longer. He is saying that when they have received the power of the Holy Spirit they will be able to go out and practice what they have seen him do. Love is meant to be our name tag as Christians. It is not just a love of good feelings. It is a love that brings us to lay down our lives for others, just as Jesus laid down his life for us. This is our great power; this is our great privilege. God has come to earth and told us what will fulfill us. He has come to earth and told us what he is hoping for from us. How does our love become practical? Our love becomes practical by doing the little things with extraordinary love. Saint Teresa of Avila said that the devil wants to get us to focus on the past and on the future, *(continued on back page)*

- Annual Diocesan Appeal 2019:** Each year, every member of our diocesan faith community is asked to participate in making a gift to support the work and ministry of Bishop Pates through the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Each of the 81 parishes in the Diocese of Des Moines has a goal that is calculated based on a formula of parish income and expenses.
