### Today's Readings

**Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7** Like the prophets before him, Isaiah is mistreated and ignored, to the point of having spittle on his face. But his face is strong like flint. A direct reference to Christ's treatment.

**Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11** St. Paul exhorts his readers to selflessness. He quotes from an extant and beautiful hymn of the early Church. It poignantly describes both the abasement and the exaltation of Christ Jesus our Lord.

**The Gospel: Mark 14: 1-15:47 or 15: 1-39** The Gospel of Mark has been described by scholars as "A Passion Narrative with a long introduction." Be that as it may, this latter part is key to the rest of the gospel.

### The Storm Before the Calm

We are entering the most important week of the church year. It is the time of the Lord's Passion. Before the celebration of the Lord's resurrection there is the painful journey that Jesus takes before He reaches the moment of triumph.

When you think about the emotional roller coaster that Jesus experience in addition to all of the physical hurts, we realize the depth of His love for us. There is the triumphal entrance into Jerusalem in which He is being hailed with palm branches waving and loud cries of, "Hosanna in the highest!" Jesus is not fooled by this mob mentality and in fact these same people will replace their cries of praise with, "Crucify Him."

Thursday things get even more intense. Jesus shares his final meal with His apostles, which becomes the foundation of our faith as the first Mass. At that meal Jesus shows that He comes to serve us by washing feet and He asks us to do the same for one another. Just before His arrest Jesus goes to pray in the garden. Despite the intensity of the moment the apostles cannot stay awake to pray with Him.

Good Friday is when all comes to a head. The arrest, the apostles abandoning Him and the horrible journey to Calvary represent the darkest hour in the history of the world. Let us commemorate this week by joining us for all Holy Week services. The Holy Thursday Mass at 7:30PM, the Good Friday service at 3PM and the Easter Vigil at 8PM will all be live streamed. However, we cannot archive them, so they are only available at the times listed.

But the really good news is, this year you can come and experience them in person with live worship which was not an option last year. There are some so focused on the cross, so as to not properly celebrate Easter. Still others declare to be "Easter people", as if we could get there without the Passion and the cross. The truth is we need both to understand life.

I hope to see many of you as we walk with Christ.

### Living Stations of the Cross at 7:30 PM

This solemn Liturgy includes lighting the Pascal Candle and Easter Proclamation, the Sacraments of Initiation for our elect, renewal of Baptismal promises, and return of the Gloria and Alleluia!
