Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Journey of Faith Begins with Questions



What is faith and how does it grow? What do Catholics believe and how is it different from other faith traditions? What does it mean to become a Catholic? How do I more fully enter into the Catholic Faith?

Perhaps you or someone you know has such questions. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process to explore these and other questions. It is often called a journey of faith in which we welcome others to the Catholic family. It is a program for those who have never been baptized, were baptized in other faith traditions, or were baptized in the Catholic faith but never completed the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation.

Looking Back Looking Ahead

Beginning with Palm Sunday, and continuing for two weeks, we were every bit of what we are called to be as a parish church. There were different emotions depending on the event. Holy Week lends itself to that each year. Jesus moves from a triumphal entry into Jerusalem where he is hailed as king to shouts of Hosanna.

There is a supper in which he teaches us to serve, while giving us the gift of Eucharist. On Friday we contemplate while participate in the reading of the Passion for the second time in five days. Holy Saturday begins in quiet darkness, but ends in total celebration for the tomb is empty and Jesus is raised. We had a parish celebration, as our catechumen, Nicole was fully initiated into the church, receiving the sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation.

In between, we had several funerals for long time parishioners. Two weeks ago, 55 of our young people, 10th graders, were confirmed by Bishop Manny Cruz in two different Masses. This weekend and last, our 2nd graders received the sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation of receiving their First Communion in May. Weddings are being celebrated, including many that had to be rescheduled because of the COVID virus.

Over the next two months this will continue, along with a number of memorial Masses for those who died during the pandemic, when their families were unable to gather. In short, slowly but surely we are moving toward more normalcy regarding our everyday affairs.

It is my hope that we can continue to trend in that direction and we will continue to monitor the situation, especially locally. In the meantime, I hope that more and more people will feel not only invited, but safe to come and join our live worship. There is no substitute for presence when it comes to celebrating Eucharist.

With warmer temperatures, an increased number of people who have been vaccinated and maintaining social distancing, and wearing masks, I feel it is a good time to return. Please stay safe and well and I look forward to seeing you real soon.
