Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Journey of Faith Begins with Questions



What is faith and how does it grow? What do Catholics believe and how is it different from other faith traditions? What does it mean to become a Catholic? How do I more fully enter into the Catholic Faith?

Perhaps you or someone you know has such questions. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process to explore these and other questions. It is often called a journey of faith in which we welcome others to the Catholic family. It is a program for those who have never been baptized, were baptized in other faith traditions, or were baptized in the Catholic faith but never completed the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation.

Doing Our Share

Over the years I have been extremely proud about many aspects of our parish. It all starts with the prayerfulness of our Sunday liturgy, the many lay ministries that exist including in the areas of liturgy, education, for both young and old, care for the physical plant and grounds, as well as fiscal responsibility by reducing costs and appealing to you when we need funds, either for general expenses or specific projects.

I am also so aware of the friendly, welcoming atmosphere that permeates the parish which visitors always comment on. You can't have a Christian community without the welcoming element being front and center.

This past year has been a challenge for us and everyone. We took a more conservative approach than some surrounding parishes. Like all things in life, some liked it, while others criticized it. As I have repeated a thousand times, our only motivation was your safety. All we did was follow the diocesan guidelines. In the end, it was about wearing masks, keeping social distancing and keeping to allowable percentages of capacity. You will see some gradual changes in the weeks ahead as we move toward normalcy, thank you for your cooperation.

At the top of my list, of how we perform as a parish, would be our generous outreach to various causes for people in great need. Whether that be our own food pantry, St Mary's food pantry, Family Promise, Eva's Kitchen, New Bridge Hospital, Habitat for Humanity and others who have come looking for financial help. Time after time you have come through.

However, there is one glaring exception when it comes to outreach, and that is the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. Throughout the archdiocese we have averaged 70% across the 200+ parishes. We stand at 20% in the bottom 5%. It is embarrassing to me, personally, but far more critical, it does not represent who we are. They have taken the archbishop out of their title because the money is for people, not the cardinal.

It helps the many poor parishes, the schools, the seminary, retired priests and religious, as well as programs for families, the young and old. NO MONEY GOES TO LAWSUITS, despite what The Bergen Record states, they are a tragic part of our past. There have been no new incidents since 2002 and many safeguards have been put in place.

We cannot simply opt out. It would be like New Jersey seceding from the U.S. In addition, in these desperate times, the cardinal has imposed a mandatory obligation of full payment, not just pledging on the goal for parishes on higher income levels. We have an expense staring us in the face of \$60,000 (equivalent to 4 Sunday collections). To date we have only collected \$15,000 of our goal of 75K. Between now and June 30th, try to help. Materials will be available in the narthex beginning next week for the next two weeks.
