On Our Religious Freedom

Declaration on Religious Liberty

On December 7, 1965, the Second Vatican Council approved *Dignitatis humanae*, the Declaration on Religious Liberty. The Declaration addresses a question that comes up in every generation: how do we understand freedom, truth, and the relationship between church and state?

Religious freedom includes two important aspects - freedom *from* and freedom *for*. "Freedom from" is probably familiar and what most of us think of as freedom. It means that we are to be free from coercion. The state is not an all-

powerful institution that can force people to act against their consciences.

The right to be free from coercion limits the power of the state. But this freedom must be paired with "freedom for," a positive orientation to seeking and acting in accordance with the truth. People have both a right *and* a duty to seek religious truth. Freedom from coercion allows the space for the pursuit of religious truth. Religious freedom requires that a society *both* refrain from preventing people from living out their religion *and* help to create the conditions for religious expression to flourish. A free society, then, is one where people actively seek religious truth and fully live out

that truth in public and private.

Parents have a fundamental right to teach their children their faith.

A most precious aspect of being human is the two-fold capacity to exercise reason and to respond to found truth. It is natural to ask, How do I live a good life? Who created this wonderful world, and how should I respond to this Creator? Why is there suffering, and how should I alleviate it? Religious traditions offer answers to these deeply human questions. It is imperative for the sake of human dignity that people are free to pursue these questions.

Mission Appeal Next Weekend

Fr. Mario Solorzano of the Diocese of Jackson, Mississippi, will be with us on Sunday July 9th to appeal for help for the Diocese of Jackson, the largest diocese east of the Mississippi River. "Our Catholic population

is around 500,000. The Diocese of Jackson has nine counties without a resident priest. An appeal came recently to hire a sister for one of these priest-less counties. We had to say, 'We're sorry. There's not

enough money.' And so, that leaves another county without Catholic presence of any kind. Won't you help us to make the church present in our diocese, which is less than 3% Catholic?"

U.S. Bishops Chairman Responds To CBO Report On Senate Health Care Bill

June 26, 2017

WASHINGTON—The nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office (CBO) today has released its score on the Senate health care bill. The score could impact how the Senate votes on the Republican plan to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act. As he is analyzing the full report, Bishop Frank Dewane of Venice, Chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Domestic Justice and Humane Development Committee, has issued the following

initial statement:

"Today, the Congressional Budget Office released a report on the 'discussion draft' of the Senate health care proposal, indicating that millions of people could lose their health insurance over time. This moment cannot pass without comment. As the **USCCB*** has consistently said, the loss of affordable access for millions of people is simply unacceptable. These are real families who need and deserve health care. We pray that the Senate will

work in an open and unified way to keep the good aspects of current health care proposals, to add missing elements where needed, and to not place our sisters and brothers who struggle every day into so great a peril on so basic a right."
