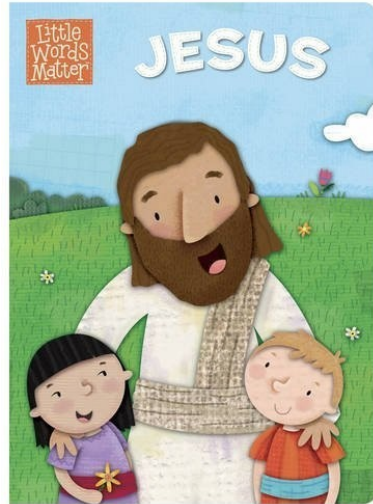


Father Tony's Corner *(continued from front page)*

invitation in our life - through obeying his will, as made clear through official Church teaching, through the commandments, or through the quiet voice of conscience. Whatever God is asking each one of us today, let us not leave this Church without saying yes. Let us go into Christmas this year well-prepared to receive Christ, with our hearts warmed up through the obedience of faith. This is what God is like - he is faithful; he keeps his promises. One of things that most saddens our Lord is that so many people do not believe this. They do not trust him. That is why they do not follow the Church's teaching, or they cut corners on it, or make exceptions to it. They let God into their lives up to a certain point, but no further. All of us are like that in some way or another. We have been so wounded by life's struggles that we have thrown up protective walls around our hearts. Nothing causes our Lord more suffering than when these walls keep him at a distance. He loves us more than we love ourselves. He wants to fill our lives with grace, wisdom, strength, and peace. That is why he came to earth in the first place. Christmas proves this love. Good Friday proves it. Easter proves it. Every detail of our Lord's life proves it. This Christmas, let us give Christ the present he wants most. Let us open our hearts to him a little bit more than we have in the past. Let us let him into the secret corner where we have been following our own lead instead of his lead, and let us say to him, 'Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done - not mine'. No present will please him more, and no present will do more good for our own interior peace and moral strength. Christ came to earth because he wanted to be close to us, so that he could save us from frustration and sorrow. This Christmas, let us make our hearts into little Bethlehem's, and let us start today, with the Holy Mass, and with the Holy Communion.

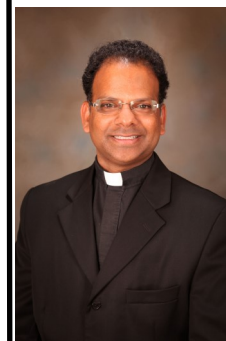

Father Tony's Corner



We have come to the final week of Advent. The readings remind us that Advent is about newness. God acts, and he does something absolutely new. Both the first reading and the gospel today refer to this newness. And they refer to it by reference to something that is a core teaching of our Catholic Faith – the Virgin Birth of Christ. In the book of Isaiah, King Ahaz is in dire straits. Enemies are besieging him, and God wants to help him out. He says, 'Ask for a sign – any sign'. But Ahaz does not really trust God, so he says 'I will not ask. I will not tempt the Lord'. Rather strange since God explicitly told him to ask. But Ahaz does not want to rely on God. And so God takes matters into his own hands. He inspires Isaiah to say: 'The Lord himself will give you this sign: the virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God with us'. Why is this important? Because for a virgin to conceive means that God has done something outside the normal course of nature. It means that he will do something new. And in the gospel, he fulfills the promise made to Ahaz 600 years earlier. The angel tells Joseph that it was through the Holy Spirit that Mary conceived. 'She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus because he will save his people from their sins'. Jesus was born of a virgin, and that means that God has done something new. God has acted to save us. This child is truly God and truly one of us. He would die to save us from our sins and restore us to friendship with God. He would give us hope, peace, and joy. God has done something absolutely new. How can we cooperate with God in bringing the newness of his saving love to our homes and our workplaces? If Christ is our Lord, if we are his followers, if we are Christians, then we will believe in him and show the firmness of that belief by obeying him. He is our King; we are his subjects; we follow his law. This is what Saint Joseph did: as soon as God made his will clear through the message of the angel, Joseph simply obeyed. There is no way that he could have understood fully the supernatural nature of Mary's pregnancy. The angel did not give a full explanation. He just said that God was behind it, and then told Joseph to take Mary into his home and name the child Jesus. Joseph could have demanded a more detailed explanation. He knew that gossip would spread; his reputation was at stake. But those worldly concerns faded away as soon as God's will became clear. Joseph believed in God, and so he fulfilled God's will. That is the obedience of faith. That is how we can continue to respond to God's

Altar & Rosary Announcement by Jodi Bassett, President

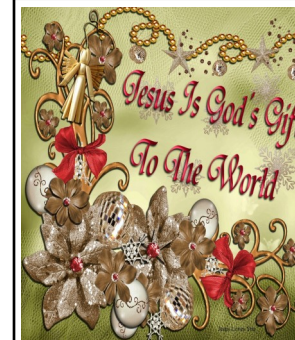
