From the Pastor: Sunday, November 13, is the feast day of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first US citizen canonized. She was canonized in 1946 and is the patroness of immigrants. Mother Cabrini was a native of Italy and came to New York in 1889 along with the members of the order she founded, the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Their mission was to attend to the spiritual and economic needs of the Italian immigrants. She founded 67 schools, orphanages, hospitals and other institutions in many cities including: New York; Chicago; Des Plaines, Illinois; Seattle; New Orleans; Denver; Golden, Colorado; Los Angeles; and Philadelphia. She was naturalized as a U.S. citizen in 1909 and died in Chicago on December 22, 1917. Mother Cabrini's first miracle involved the healing of an infant who had been blinded through the application of excess silver nitrate solution (50% instead of 1%). The child's eyes had been destroyed and his face had been badly burned by the corrosive solution. Members of Mother Cabrini's order spent the night in the chapel pleading for Mother Cabrini's intercession. By the next morning, the infant had been healed and the only sign of the damage were two small scars on his cheek. This miracle occurred in New York City in 1921.

In 1938, a 17 year old young man attended the beatification of Mother Cabrini. His name was Peter Smith. Those who stood near him notice his eyes that need no glasses and that his face was smooth. Only those who know to look carefully for them make out the two tiny scars where deadly nitrate solution once burned a furrow down his cheeks. Entering the seminary after serving in the army during WWII, he was ordained in 1951. Fr. Peter Smith served in the Diocese of Corpus Christi for over 40 years. He entered into eternal life in 2002.

Mother Cabrini was canonized in 1946 and is the patron of immigrants.

Our very own Christopher Livelsberger is in his 2nd year of Diaconate School for the Diocese of Hbg. He has another 2 semesters this year and has 3 more years to go. Please keep him and his family in your prayers. Its great knowing another vocation is coming through our Parish. Pray for more!
