made a complete recovery. She was no longer a patient of the hospital after about a month, and she went on to resume her duties as the head of a sanitarium in New Orleans. She lived until 1942 dying of a pulmonary embolism. Upon autopsy, a healthy, normal size pancreas was found—no sign of cancer. This miracle was accepted in 1961 by the Apostolic See and contributed to Mother Seton's beatification in 1963; she was canonized on September 14, 1975 and her feast day is celebrated on January 4. Pastor's Column: On December 28, 1934 Sister Gertrude Korzendorfer went into a hospital in New Orleans complaining of pain in the area of her stomach. A surgeon found pancreatic cancer (a tumor about the size of an orange). The surgeon's opinion was that it could not be removed noting: "She would have died immediately" as it was matted to the surrounding organs. The Sisters in her congregation, along with the ones that staffed the hospital, began praying for Sister Gertrude by praying for Elizabeth Ann Seton's intercession with God. Miraculously, Sister Gertrude
