“Lazarus, come out!”

There are many ways to receive this indulgence; however, one method that can be met easily is as follows:

- 1) in a spirit of faith in God and charity towards our brothers and sister, pray for those suffering from Covid-19 virus (one Our Father and One Hail Mary);
- 2) recite the Creed (Apostles or Nicene);
- 3) recite one Our Father;
- 4) recite one Hail Mary;
- 5) And have the intent to fulfill the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the Holy Father’s intention (one Our Father and one Hail Mary), as soon as possible. A practical suggestion: this indulgence may be received once a day and may be obtained for yourself or for a soul in Purgatory. On the first day, you may wish to obtain the indulgence for yourself and on succeeding days pray with in intent that it be applied to a soul in Purgatory.
