RESPECT LIFE REFLECTION: From today's Gospel, John 9: "If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying 'We see, so our sin remains.' Do not be neutral when life is indiscriminately taken or abused.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. **Good Friday** is a day of **abstinence** from meat & also a day of **fast**, that is only *one full meal* is allowed. Two other meatless meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to one's needs, but together they may not equal another full meal.
2. The other **Fridays** of Lent are days of **abstinence** from meat.
3. The obligation to **abstain** from meat commences at fourteen (14) years of age.
4. The obligation to **fast** commences at eighteen (18) and ends at fifty-nine (59) years of age.

Although the faithful enjoy *freedom of conscience* to excuse themselves for a just cause from these laws of *fast and abstinence*, the obligation to do penance is a serious one and they should substitute another form of penance. No Catholic should lightly excuse himself/herself from this obligation in the Lenten season.
