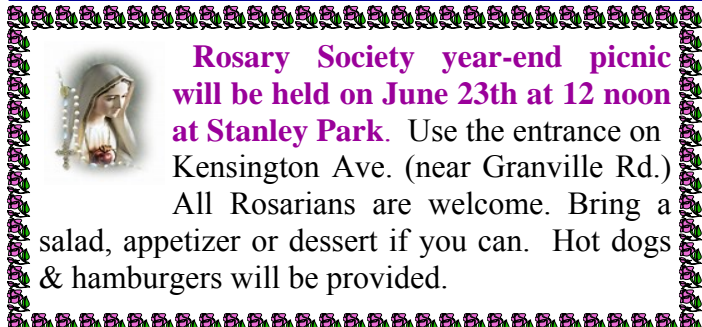


Time & Talent – Stewardship
