The Second collection for St. Joseph Seminary will be taken this weekend at all Masses. Your generosity and prayers for the seminarians are deeply appreciated.

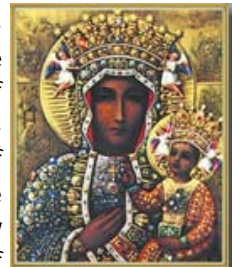
ANNOUNCING THE 2018 PUBLIC SQUARE ROSARY CRUSADE

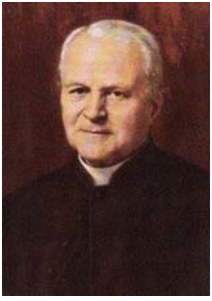

Father Eugene Prevost

1860 - 1946

The Early Years

Eugene Prevost was born in Saint Jerome, in the Province of Quebec, on April 24, 1860. He was eighth in a family of fifteen children. He grew up in a happy and hard-working home, according to the traditions of the times. His father Jules, a medical doctor, was for over forty years the devoted physician to the settlers of the region and a good friend of the Apostle of colonization, the famous Curé Labelle. From his family Eugene learned to think big and to be courageous.

After a formal classical education at the Collège de Sainte-Thérèse and two years of philosophy with the Sulpicians in Montréal, young Eugene, who was attracted to the Eucharist, left his family and native land to enter the novitiate of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament in Brussels, Belgium (1881-1883). In Rome, he studied for four years at the Gregorian University and was ordained priest on June 4, 1887. That same year he was sent to Paris to direct the Association of Priest Adorers.

Everything for the Priest

Saint Peter-Julian Eymard, the founder of the Blessed Sacrament Fathers and Brothers, had written: "I would abandon everything for priests." During his thirteen years of ministry with priests, Father Prevost had been able to verify the validity of his founder's statement. The spiritual and temporal needs of the clergy were evident: no religious community was exclusively consecrated to priests. The time seemed appropriate to put into action the ideal of Saint Peter-Julian.

Father Prevost met many obstacles in the realization of his project. He prayed for a long time to discern the will of God. Finally, after being wisely counselled, he left the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament to care only for priests and, on February 17, 1901, Pope Leo XIII approved the foundation of the "Sacerdotal Fraternity" for men and the Oblates of Bethany for women.

The Founder

For forty-five years, Father Prevost worked patiently, in humility and suffering, to give a firm foundation to his new Congregation. He was courageous throughout the many trials which were to come his way: poverty, the lack of vocations, contradictions, two World Wars, etc. Convinced of his calling, he relied on Jesus alone.

Consecrated to Jesus Priest in the Eucharist and to his priests, the two Congregations he founded continue to strive, through their adoration before the Blessed Sacrament and their apostolate, to help priests in their many needs with a particular emphasis on their spiritual life.

Father Prevost opened ten houses of the Sacerdotal Fraternity and two convents of the Oblates of Bethany. Thousands of priests of every race and category were objects of his charity and that of the members of his community. A prolific writer, he composed numerous works on the priesthood, the Eucharist, the life of love, etc. To his spiritual family he left an abundance of literature, counsels and orientations for their specific vocation.

He died piously on August 1, 1946 at La Beuvriere, France. Today his mortal remains rest in the graveyard of the Sacerdotal Fraternity at Pointe-du-Lac, near Trois-Rivières, Quebec

54 DAY ROSARY NOVENA

A Holy Hour of Reparation for the sexual sins of priests and for the sanctification of the clergy will be held on December 8 following the 1:00 p.m. Mass. The final Rosary of the 54-day Novena will be prayed at this time.
