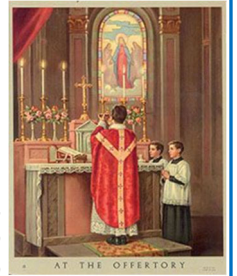

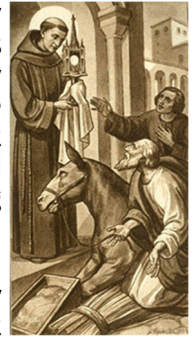

### THE MIRACLE OF ST. ANTHONY AND THE MULE

One of the reasons why Anthony worked so hard to convert heretics was because he genuinely felt sorry for them. He saw that they were depriving themselves of the most precious gift of the Eucharist, and he believed that no one could long survive without this spiritual nourishment.



One day, a heretic told Anthony that he would believe that Christ was truly present in the Eucharist only if his mule bowed down to it.

They established that the test should take place in three days. The heretic starved his mule for the next three days. When the appointed time had arrived, Anthony stood off to one side with the consecrated host in his hands, while the heretic stood to the other holding some fodder for the mule to eat. The mule, ignoring its own extreme hunger, went before the Eucharist and knelt down to adore the Blessed Sacrament.

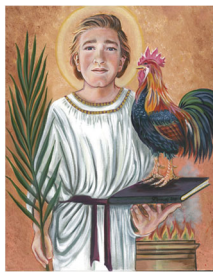

## THE 14 HOLY HELPERS

June 15: St. Vitus (also called St. Guy), martyr, was born in the third century to pagan parents. As a young boy Vitus had the good fortune to be raised by a pious nurse named Crescentia who, with her husband Modestus, taught Vitus the faith. He embraced wholeheartedly the teachings of the Church and was secretly baptized.

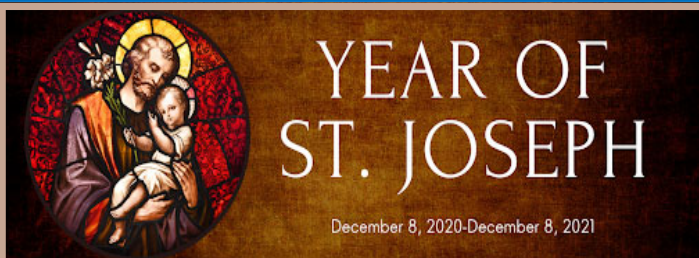


When his pagan father heard of this he was quite incensed and did all in his power to turn his son away from the Christian faith. Since promises and threats were of no avail, he handed Vitus over to a pagan judge who had him whipped. As the pagan father was planning a more severe punishment, Vitus was warned by an angel to flee. Accordingly, he departed in the company of Modestus and Crescentia into foreign lands.

During this exile Vitus attained such a reputation for holiness that the fame of it reached the emperor Diocletian himself. The emperor, who had a son possessed by a devil, summoned Vitus to come and cure his son. Vitus did so, but the ungrateful emperor, not being able to persuade Vitus to worship the pagan gods, cast him into prison, together with Modestus and Crescentia.

As they remained steadfast in chains, the emperor then commanded that they be thrown into a cauldron of melted lead, resin and pitch. Like the three Hebrew youths, however, these martyrs sang hymns and remained unharmed. Next Diocletian had them thrown to a lion, which lay down before them and licked their feet. The emperor, now more furious than ever, ordered them to be stretched on a scaffold such that their limbs were broken and all their bones dislocated. As this torture was going on, there were great clap of thunder, bolts of lightning and earthquakes, which caused the temples of the gods to fall down while many pagans were converted.

St. Vitus is invoked against epilepsy, chorea (called "St. Vitus' Dance"), lethargy, paralysis, diseases of the nervous system and the bites of poisonous or mad animals, against lightning and storms and for protection of domestic animals. He is considered the patron of actors and is often depicted with a rooster for when he was thrown into the cauldron, a rooster was thrown in as an anti-sorcery antidote.



## HOLY INNOCENTS BOOKSHELF

*Carlo Acutis*  
*A Millennial in Paradise*

In each generation, heroes of the Faith, whom the Church recognizes as saints, emerge. There are many characteristics that they have in common, but none thus far have used cell phones, played PlayStation video games, or searched for information on Google.



That is about to change.

A young "computer geek" named Carlo Acutis, who created a website cataloguing every reported Eucharistic miracle in the world and died of leukemia a year later at age fifteen, was beatified in November 2019, after a healing miracle in Brazil was attributed to his intercession. Since the beatification ceremony one year later, solemn crowds have been filing past the exposed relics of the blessed youth in Assisi's Church of Santa Maria Maggiore.

Carlo is a sign of contradiction in the modern world who serves as a heroic model for today's young people—a teenager who programmed computers and enjoyed films and comics yet lived as an authentic and sincere disciple of Christ. In these pages, you'll discover how he embraced the Faith as a boy and developed the virtues necessary to live a Christ-centered life in a secular society, how he overcame the vices that plagued him, and how he gracefully dealt with heartaches he could not divulge even to his parents.

When he developed leukemia, he offered his suffering both for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Catholic Church, saying: "I offer all the suffering I will have to undergo for the Lord, for the Pope, and the Church." In this surprising and inspiring book, you'll also learn:

- His strategy for resisting peer pressure.
- How he had fun without losing control and learned to resist gluttony

- How he dealt with friends who were sexually promiscuous and what he told them
- How he responded to the shocking news that he was dying (which happened two weeks later)
