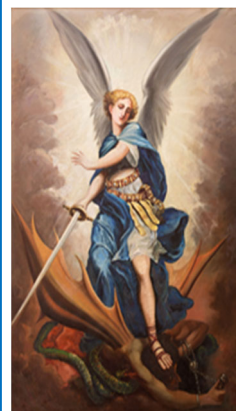

Holy Souls in Purgatory

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF TIXTLA, MEXICO, 2006

In our recent times, there has been an escalation in Eucharistic miracles, which have been analyzed and confirmed by the Catholic Church. The miracle, which occurred in Tixtla on October 21, 2006



is one of those. It happened during a parish retreat when the pastor of St. Martin of Tours parish, Fr. Raymundo Reyan Esteban invited Fr. Leopoldo Roque to give a retreat to the parishioners. During Mass and the distribution of Holy Communion, a religious sister who was assisting Fr. Leopoldo, noticed a reddish substance emanating from a consecrated Host in the ciborium. After being reported, the local Bishop, Most Reverend Alejo Zavala Castro assembled a theological commission to investigate. Dr. Ricardo Castañon Gomez, the prominent scientist who had done the in-depth research in two of the Eucharistic miracles that took place in Buenos Aires at Santa Maria parish, was brought in to study the Host. Extensive investigations were conducted from October 2009 to October 2012 and the conclusive evidence gave credence to its supernatural character.

The findings were made public on May 25, 2013 at an international symposium in the Diocese of Chilpancingo. The findings confirmed and strengthened the faith of the thousands who were present.

- Cardiac tissue generally dies after +8 hours, yet 3 months had passed before the analysis was conducted, and it was confirmed the sample was live cardiac muscle tissue;
- Human blood type AB;
- Blood contained hemoglobin and DNA of human origin, yet no genetic profile was obtainable;
- The upper layer of coagulated blood had dried some, but the lower layers showed the presence of fresh blood indicating the Blood was emanating from the interior of the Host;
- Intact red and white blood cells were identified; and
- Tissue studied had a distinct likeness of being lacerated, while containing recovery mechanisms, which is found in living tissue.

On October 121, 2013, Bishop Alejo of the Diocese of Chilpancingo-Chilapa gave full recognition in a pastoral letter that the bleeding Host was a Divine Sign and the series of events related to the bleeding Host were of supernatural character.

THE FOURTEEN HOLY HELPERS

St. Margaret of Antioch, Virgin & Martyr - July 20th

According to the ancient martyrologies, she suffered at Antioch in the last general persecution of the Church in the early fourth century. Like St. Vitus, she was instructed in the Faith by a Christian nurse and was persecuted by her own father who was a pagan priest. She suffered many torments before being executed by the sword.



Devotion to St. Margaret began in the East but spread to Western Europe, where she began to be greatly honored in England, France and Germany in the eleventh century. She is pictured holding a dragon in chains. Although a virgin, she is invoked by women who are pregnant or in labor. She is also invoked by those suffering from kidney disease or backache and for deliverance from devils. She was one of the saints who appeared to St. Joan of Arc regarding her mission.

St. Christopher, Martyr - July 25th



St. Christopher is one of the most popular and well-known saints, although little is known for certain of his life. The Roman Martyrology simply states that he was beaten at Lycia with iron rods under the Emperor Decius and "was preserved by the power of Christ from being burnt in the raging flames. At last, pierced through with arrow-wounds, he fulfilled his martyrdom by beheading."

Many legends have grown up around this saint, who is often pictured as a giant carrying the Child Jesus on his shoulders across a river. In fact, his name means "Christ-bearer." He is invoked against the plague, sudden death, epilepsy and toothaches. He is especially the patron of motorists and other travelers and is also invoked during storms.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL (1581-1660) - July 19th

In April 1830, prior to the visions of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, the remains of Vincent de Paul were translated to the Vincentian church in Paris. The solemnities included a novena. On three successive evenings, upon returning from the church to the rue du Bac, Catherine Laboure had the first vision of the heart of St. Vincent de Paul over a small reliquary in the Chapel of the Sisters. It has the color of flesh and skin and looked like an inner human organ. Catherine understood that the clear color announced peace, innocence and union.



The following day in the same place, the heart of Saint Vincent of Paul appeared again. Catherine relates: "I have seen it red as fire because it must illuminate the charity of hearts. It seemed to me that the whole community should renew and go all the places in the world."

On the third day Catherine saw the heart between red and black and this produced a great sadness in her heart which was difficult to overcome. She understood the meaning of this vision as a possible change in government and the return of the revolution which would bring about religious persecution and profanations that were going to take place in France, and particularly in Paris.

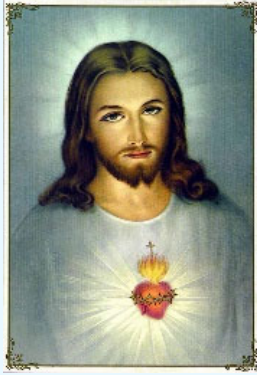

THE SABBATINE PRIVILEGE

The Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel even extends to Purgatory.

The Sabbatine Privilege is based on the Papal Bull issued on March 3, 1322 by Pope John XXII. This Privilege was approved and confirmed by many popes including St. Pius V. It essentially says that those who wear the Scapular and fulfill two other conditions can obtain early liberation from Purgatory, through the special intercession of the Virgin Mary, on the day consecrated to her, Saturday.



The other two conditions are: 1) Observe chastity according to one's state in life and 2) Recite the Little Office of Our Blessed Mother (the Rosary, with permission from a priest, can be substituted for the office). Our Lady revealed to Venerable Dominic of Jesus and Mary: "Although many wear my Scapular, only a few fulfill conditions for the Sabbatine Privilege." We maintain the majority don't know them. It is an act of charity to make the Sabbatine Privilege known to all. A soul from Purgatory was asked by a Sister: "What is the average stay of the souls in Purgatory?" The Poor Soul answered: "From thirty to forty years!" Can you see the importance of making Our Lady's Privilege known - if you consider that the flames of Purgatory are similar to those of Hell!

A last reminder - we give you the message of one pastor. He said: "If I were positive that all my parishioners died wearing the Brown Scapular, I would be most certain that we would all meet in Heaven." If this pastor can be so certain about his parishioners, why can't all pastors be just as certain? Why can't every father and mother be certain of their children, family and friends? Explain to them the SCAPULAR PROMISE and the SABBATINE PRIVILEGE. Heed Our Lady's wish: "Wear the Scapular devoutly and perseveringly...It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace." **Brown Scapular enrollment TODAY at 10:00 a.m. FOR ALL THOSE NEVER BEFORE ENROLLED!**

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM - Fourth Month

Your baby's brain has begun maturing - a process that will continue until she is about 14 years old. Her eyelids are now sealed and will re-open at 7 months. Her taste buds are now working. Nutrients consumed by her mother are passed on to her within an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to parents of the baby can be seen at this time. This month REMS (rapid eye movements) have been recorded - a sign of dreaming. Your baby is now about 9 inches in length.
