### MASS ATTENDANCE

For Catholics, Mass attendance is a vital part of weekly life. It is the time to gather together in God's presence, to be nourished by God and by one another. We listen to the words of the Scripture, we pray together and we share the Body & Blood of Christ.



13<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18**

God is just and does not show favoritism, but hears the prayers of everyone. Anyone who serves God, no matter how lowly his position here on earth, will be heard and answered.

**Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18**

Paul writes to Timothy that he thinks his mission is near the end, and he is glad his faith is still strong. Paul hopes that all nations will hear the gospel. But, if he is executed as he anticipates, he is sure he will live forever in heaven.

**Gospel: Luke 18:9-14**

Jesus tells a parable about a Pharisee who went to the temple, and offered up a prayer of thanks because he was not a sinner like the tax collector who was also there to pray. The tax collector was far more humble, acknowledging his sins, and asking forgiveness for them. Jesus said the tax collector's prayer would be heard because, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, while he who humbles himself will be exalted."

**A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS  
HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly**

**"The Lord is not deaf to the wail of the orphan, nor to the widow when she pours out her complaint. The one who serves God willingly is heard, his petition reaches the heavens. The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest until it reaches its goal, nor will it withdraw till the Most High responds, judges justly and affirms the right..."**

Why pray? God does not care! He seems to be deaf. How often we have felt this way? How frequently we are tempted to give up? Somehow the grace of God revives me, reminds me, and restores me as a person of faith and prayer.

When Pope Francis was asked 'who are you?' he replied by saying 'I am a sinner.' It is the sinner person who approaches the Lord with confidence, eyes down, asking 'O God be merciful to me a sinner.'

Perhaps our approach to God in prayer is not to be limited to what I want, though I am told to ask, but to ask God for what I need most from His point of view. The prayer of mercy 'Jesus I trust in you' can take on even greater meaning. My petition reaches the heaven and pierces the clouds, and reaches its goal.

**BIBLE STUDY-** A faith enrichment class entitled “**An Introduction to Sacred Scripture or What is the Bible Anyway?**” will be offered on five Wednesday evenings at 7:00 P.M. beginning on November 2 in the St. Joseph parish center (34 South Chestnut St., New Paltz) .
