## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

Abraham pleads with the Lord, who planned to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah because of the evil and sin in those cities. Abraham asks him if he would spare the city if fifty, forty, thirty, twenty or even only ten innocent people were found there. God says that he would spare the cities even for the sake of only ten.

### Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Paul explains to the Colossians that through baptism, they are raised to life with Christ because they believed in the power of the God who raised him from the dead. Even though they once lived in sin, their sins have been pardoned through Jesus.

### Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Jesus' disciples asked him how they should pray. He gave them some phrases similar to those now used in the Lord's prayer. Jesus also reminds the disciples how even men with sins are able to give good things to their children, and explains how much more the heavenly Father wants to give to us.

## A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY *by Rev. William J. Reilly*

**“Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, ‘Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples.’ He said to them, ‘When you pray, say, Father, hallowed be your name...”**

Jesus directed His prayer to the Father. Paul tells us we can pray only through the inspiration of the Spirit. The Trinity is found in every prayer, ‘How much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?’

We, like the disciple, ask the Lord to help us to pray and to pray better. We pray in response to the Spirit's urging. We pray in many ways, with words, in silent meditation and reflection, we pray with our hands in serving others. Jesus is ever present to lead us, strengthening our prayer life.

Let's use an example. In teaching people how to swim we can tell them to close their mouths, kick their feet, move their arms and hold their breath. That's teaching technique, but is not swimming. One must enter the water and try.

Prayer is no different. We learn to pray better by praying. Like swimming we are refreshed and renewed by our experience.

## SOCIETY FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH COLLECTION JULY 28 & 29

This weekend, we welcome Fr. Jean Tounoussia Sassou who will speak in behalf of Diocese of Garoua.

The archdiocese of Garoua is located in the north of Cameroon, which happened to be the least educated and less developed part of the country. In the bid to fight ignorance, unemployment, immoralities, street children phenomenon and poverty, the archdiocese of Garoua founded St Andrew secondary school in 2012. Now with more than 600 students for a building of 4 classrooms, there is insufficiency of classrooms to accommodate all the students and properly educate them.

The proceeds of the appeal will be to build one or more classrooms to get those who still have classes under trees and in straw huts to be sheltered and have proper eye contact with their teachers.

Believing that education is the most powerful weapon we can use to change mentalities and our environment, it is our wish that with the support of St Charles Borromeo church, you will help us fulfil this mission. Your donation will make a huge difference. Thanks for your generosity.
