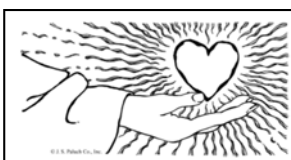
Your Help Is Needed FEEDING THE HOMELESS Saturday, June 1

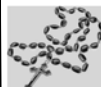

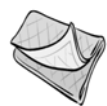

2019 Christian Marriage Anniversary Liturgies

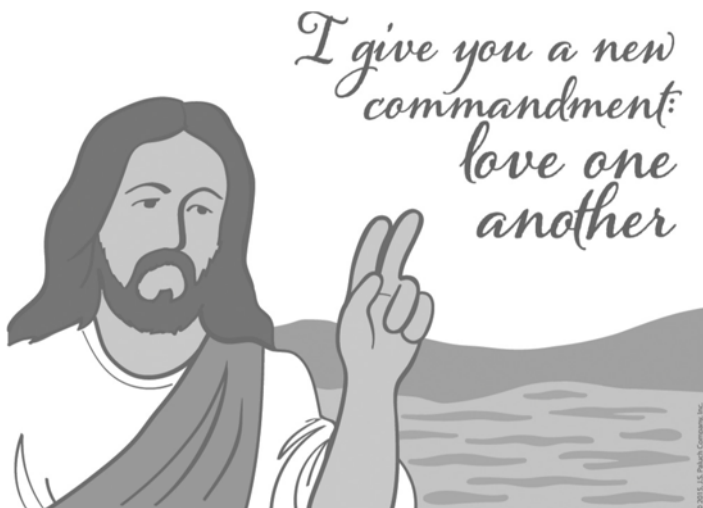

A MESSENGER OF HOPE
FROM PADUA, ITALY



We are blessed with the very rare opportunity to see and venerate 823-year-old First Class Relic of Saint Anthony of Padua on June 15. These are slivers of skin from his cheek and a fragment of his rib. The relics are on a "World Tour" which began at the Pontifical Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua, Italy where the Saint is buried. Father Alessandro Ratti, an OFM Conventual Franciscan Friars who ministers in the Basilica accompanies the relic.

Saint Anthony is the saint who is most prayed to of all the saints and best known as the saint of lost things. Over the years people have prayed for their health, healing from all diseases, family peace, anything that is in their hearts.

they have prayed to Saint Anthony. He was only 36 years old when he died and was canonized in less than a year after his death, the fastest time in the history of the church. St. Anthony's appeal had endured through the centuries and now millions of people visit his tomb in Italy each year. Saint Anthony was a person of peace. We pray that by venerating his relic, we will find peace and healing.

During the veneration, Holy Cards will be distributed. You can also write your petitions to St. Anthony and drop it in the basket next to the relic. The tour ends back at the tomb of St. Anthony in Padua where the friars will gather and recite prayers for the saint's intercession on your petitions and intentions.

"By inviting us to venerate the mortal remains of the martyrs and saints, the Church does not forget that, in the end, these are indeed just human bones, but they are bones that belonged to individuals touched by the living power of God. The relics of the saints are traces of that invisible but real presence which sheds light upon the shadows of the world and reveals the Kingdom of Heaven in our midst. They cry out with us and for us: "Maranatha!" - "Come, Lord Jesus!."
