The Archbishop's Annual Appeal

Through your generosity, we have surpassed (in pledges) our 2019 AAA goal. The goal was \$94,000. We have in pledges \$115,858 with 238 families participating.

Now the work of the parish is to make sure those pledges are honored. To date, we have received \$98,218 toward those pledges. There is a balance to be collected of \$17,640.

If all pledges are fulfilled, then Most Blessed Sacrament Parish will receive 62% of all funds received over our assigned goal. At this point, that would mean MBS would receive a rebate check from the Archdiocese of Newark. We have included this amount as anticipated income in our fiscal 2020 budget. Thank you for fulfilling your pledges!

These four letters stand for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is a faith journey for adults desiring to become full members of the Catholic Church. Through a gradual process of prayer, faith sharing, study, and rituals, the R.C.I.A. process prepares people for full initiation within the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and/or Eucharist.

The R.C.I.A. process is designed especially for:

- Adults never baptized who might desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults baptized in another Christian church who might desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults baptized Catholic who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Please note that one of the qualifications to be a baptismal godparent or Confirmation sponsor is that he/she is a fully initiated Catholic, i.e., the person has received the Sacraments of Initiation of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

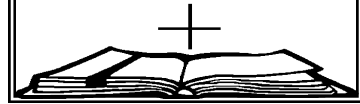

November: The Month Dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory *How to Help Yourself and Others Get to Heaven*

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of Heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... for the Lord Himself shall come down from Heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise."

One of the most powerful means of helping our brothers and sisters in Purgatory get to Heaven is by gaining indulgences for them.

By the practice of indulgences, the Church places at our disposal the inexhaustible treasure for the remission of punishment for sins, and as such, we, the living, are able to apply those indulgences for the souls of the dead who have not yet attained the joys of being in the presence of Our Beloved Savior.

An indulgence is a special grace dispensed by the Church when we perform a particular action and fulfill the conditions of the indulgence (specifically, go to confession within 20 days, receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father).

Here is the key: we can gain a **plenary indulgence** for ourselves or for a soul in Purgatory if we spend at least a half an hour in Adoration before the Eucharistic Lord and fulfill the conditions mentioned previously. A plenary indulgence offers the complete remission of all temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven. Please think about that. You can help yourself and your loved ones in Purgatory get to Heaven.....you can assist forgotten souls in Purgatory who have no one to pray for them. And you can rest assured that if you help souls currently in Purgatory get to Heaven.....they will help us and those whom we love on our journey to Paradise.

The power of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is tremendous.

Eucharistic Adoration at MBS will be held on First Friday, November 1, 2019
(from 10 AM – 4 PM) and First Saturday, November 2, 2019 (from 9:30 AM – 4:30 PM).

We need adorers to sign up and commit to a specific hour of adoration for both First Friday and First Saturday. The sign-up sheets for both days are in the narthex. Of course, even if you are unable to sign up for a specific hour, please come whenever you are able....and stay for as long as you can.
