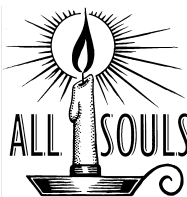

These four letters stand for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is a faith journey for adults desiring to become full members of the Catholic Church. Through a gradual process of prayer, faith sharing, study, and rituals, the R.C.I.A. process prepares people for full initiation within the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and/or Eucharist.

The R.C.I.A. process is designed especially for:

- Adults never baptized who might desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults baptized in another Christian church who might desire to become a Catholic.
- Adults baptized Catholic who have not received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation. Please note that one of the qualifications to be a baptismal godparent or Confirmation sponsor is that he/she is a fully initiated Catholic, i.e., the person has received the Sacraments of Initiation of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

2019 Sharing God's Blessings:

The Archbishop's Annual Appeal

Through your generosity, we have surpassed (in pledges) our 2019 AAA goal. The goal was \$94,000. We have in pledges \$115,908 with 239 families participating.

Now the work of the parish is to make sure those pledges are honored. To date, we have received \$98,838 toward those pledges. There is a balance to be collected of \$17,070.

If all pledges are fulfilled, then Most Blessed Sacrament Parish will receive 62% of all funds received over our assigned goal. At this point, that would mean MBS would receive a rebate check from the Archdiocese of Newark. We have included this amount as anticipated income in our fiscal 2020 budget. Thank you for fulfilling your pledges!

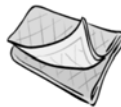
