

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Today's celebration of Palm Sunday begins what we know as Holy Week. As I mentioned last week, "we miss you," and that is most especially felt this week in which we celebrate the Sacred Triduum. Once we are able to come together again for Sunday worship, our "plan" will be to distribute the blessed palms to you at that time.

This Thursday is Holy Thursday, the day in which we commemorate Jesus giving to us the gift of the Eucharist, his Most Holy Body and Blood - the sacrament after which our very own Parish is named. Sadly, our Eucharistic fast that began weeks ago will continue on Holy Thursday.

In addition, Holy Thursday celebrates the institution of the priesthood by Jesus Christ the Great High Priest. It is equally sad that because of the Coronavirus, and self-isolation, quarantines, and social distancing, priests are unable to do what they were ordained to do: by offering prayers at wakes, presiding at funerals, witnessing an engaged couple's exchange of vows on their wedding day, to name a few.

As we enter these days of this most sacred week, let us not be discouraged, let us not be afraid. As we gaze in meditation at the face of Jesus on Good Friday, let us be supported by the strength of our crucified Lord. Even on the cross, Jesus had total trust in his heavenly Father. Because of our baptismal gifts of faith, hope, and love we are empowered to do the same.

I hope you had the opportunity last Friday to listen to Pope Francis' extraordinary *Urbi et Orbi* address. Perhaps this excerpt from it could be used as a part of your meditation this week. Towards the end of his address the Holy Father said:

"The Lord asks us and, in the midst of our tempest, invites us to reawaken and put into practice that solidarity and hope capable of giving strength, support and meaning to these hours when everything seems to be floundering. The Lord awakens so as to reawaken and revive our Easter faith. We have an anchor: by his cross we have been saved. We have a rudder: by his cross we have been redeemed. We have a hope: by his cross we have been healed and embraced so that nothing and no one can separate us from his redeeming love. In the midst of isolation when we are suffering from a lack of tenderness and chances to meet up, and we experience the loss of so many things, let us once again listen to the proclamation that saves us: he is risen and is living by our side. The Lord asks us from his cross to rediscover the life that awaits us, to look towards those who look to us, to strengthen, recognize and foster the grace that lives within us. Let us not quench the wavering flame (cf. Is 42:3) that never falters, and let us allow hope to be rekindled."

Let us continue to pray for each other during this most sacred week. Through the intercession of Saint Joseph, and Mary, our Good Mother, may God bless you with health, strength, and peace.

WELCOMING R.C.I.A. CANDIDATES TO MBS

(This is the final of five profiles welcoming the R.C.I.A. candidates from the Church of the Most Blessed Sacrament to the parish community.)



Ms. Alexandria Kolodko embarked on her RCIA journey at the urging of her godson.

“Originally I was asked to be a godmother,” Alexandria said, “but without my being confirmed, I couldn’t do that, so I started out thinking it was something I should do for my godson. But it also happened to be something that was always

missing for me, and being raised Catholic and never fulfilling my confirmation was something I always wanted do, and now my godson gave me that push. I would do anything for him.”

Alexandria notes that one of the most immediate results of her participation in the R.C.I.A. process was that, “I started going to church more and realizing this is something I want to continue doing. Being from Poland, being Catholic and going to church is very important to my community and its something I feel more connected to.”

That sense of connection and family comes naturally. “My family and I run a family business,” Alexandria says. “We are importers and wholesale distributors of Eastern European food products. It’s such a joy to me that I am close with my family and that we all get to work together everyday.”

She says that when not working, she likes to travel, learn and see new places.

What she is looking forward to once she has completed the sacraments?

“Well, for one thing, I can officially be a godmother at my godson’s christening,” she said. “Beyond that, I look forward to feeling more complete as a Catholic, and participating more fully in its community.”



A NOTE FROM FATHER JOHN ABOUT SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Have you ever heard the expression, *Spiritual Communion*?

The expression *Spiritual Communion* has not been a regular part of our Catholic vocabulary in the recent past, but it is a practice in the Roman Catholic Church.

Saint Jean Marie Vianney, who lived in France in the 17th and 18th centuries and who is the patron saint of parish priests said, “If we are deprived of Sacramental Communion, let us replace it, as far as we can, by Spiritual Communion, which we can make every moment; for we ought to have always a burning desire to receive the good God.”

“When you do not receive Communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a Spiritual Communion, which is a most beneficial practice,” wrote Saint Teresa of Jesus, “by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you.” Saint Teresa of Jesus was a mystic from Spain who lived in the 16th century.

The great theologian and Doctor of the Church Saint Thomas Aquinas (13th century) described it as “an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace him” at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion.

Certainly, these weeks - as we deal with the Coronavirus - have seen the necessity for Spiritual Communion as we find ourselves self-isolating and in quarantine situations.

Spiritual Communion requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the Sacrament and a turning to Jesus with the heart.

One of the most popular prayers of Spiritual Communion is one composed by Saint Alphonsus Liguori (an Italian moral theologian) in the 1700s:

*My Jesus,
I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I desire to receive
You into my soul.
Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself
wholly to You.
Never permit me to be separated from You.
Amen.*

In these days when we are not be able to attend Mass, let us rely on the wisdom of Saints Jean Marie Vianney, Thomas Aquinas, Teresa of Jesus, and Alphonsus Liguori. May their intercession help us all during this challenging time. Holy Saints of God, pray for us!


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

BUILDING A CHURCH...CONTINUING A MISSION Committee Report

The third meeting of the Church Restoration Committee was held, via conference call, on Thursday, March 26, 2020.

At that time, committee chair Frank Bivona reviewed the parish's progress in the four following areas:

First, clean-up of the site of the fire began on Monday, March 23, and is expected to be substantially completed by the second week in April. An e-mail notice about the start of the work was sent to all parishioners. Unfortunately, no sacred vessels (including the tabernacle) were recovered in the clean-up effort.



Second, discussions continue with the Archdiocese regarding insurance. The two basic components of the claim remain the actual building structure itself (including code enhancements) and the replacement of the contents destroyed in the fire. The MBS staff has compiled a comprehensive summary of those contents. There are also expenses relating to "business interruption" (ie, all of the additional costs generated by having to move church services and other ministries to different locations) that will have to be considered on an "on-going" basis.



Third, it is possible that there will be a gap between the resources the parish ultimately has in hand (from the settlement of the insurance claim, donations and pledges to the capital campaign and gifts to the church restoration) and the real cost of rebuilding the church, chapel and community center. The committee is working to create a realistic rebuilding budget in order to provide a better picture of what fundraising may yet need to be done so that the project is fully funded when work is ready to begin.

Fourth, Foresight/LAN Associates, the architectural firm engaged by Most Blessed Sacrament to lead the church rebuild, outlined a plan to develop a preliminary Schematic Design proposal based on the input of the parish. To that end, parishioners were invited to participate in one of two workshops (April 2 at 7:00 pm OR April 4 at 10:00 am) and to provide their responses to a group of questions about their experience as parishioners and, in particular, their worship experience in the old church. The responses to those questions will form the foundation of the Schematic Design report. As Father John explained in his letter of March 11, the Schematic Design report will focus on five key areas: 1) prioritizing project requirements 2) providing preliminary conceptual drawings 3) reviewing municipal code and zoning regulations 4) providing rough drawings of site plans, floor plans and elevations and 5) designing illustrative sketches and/or computer renderings). Foresight/Lan expects to deliver its Schematic Design report in June.

Because of limitations created by the coronavirus self-quarantine, and the fact that so many elements of the rebuilding program are "in process", the next Committee meeting has not been determined, but is expected to take place in late-April or early May.
