

The Road to Emmaus: Going the Wrong Way

In his Christmas homily Bishop Flesey referenced the movie *Going My Way*. If I had to write a screenplay for today's Gospel passage, I would probably give it the title: *Going the Wrong Way*.

I would probably cast it with the two characters Cleopas and his companion as wearing dark sunglasses, perhaps wearing a disguise, showing signs of confusion, disappointment, fear, running away and getting into their car, and driving away at a fast speed, noticing the road sign that said: Emmaus: 7 miles.

Suddenly, a voice comes from the car's navigation device and says: "You have left the planned route. Would you like directions to get back on route? If so, pull over to the side of the road." They stop the car, and the person whose voice they heard is now standing next to the car. Of course, the person is Jesus (I haven't cast that role yet), and Jesus says to Cleopas and his companion: "Let me help you with directions to where you really need to be... because you're going the wrong way."

That is how far I got in writing this screenplay. But I think you see the point. Sometimes in life, perhaps many times in life, we are going in the wrong direction, The two disciples are running away from Jerusalem, the center of everything, the place of the Last Supper, the cross, the resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit, turning to fear and despair...things had not worked out as they had planned or expected. Has this ever happened to you? I will let you fill in your own examples of what that means, because we have all been there. But the one constant through it all, is the presence of Jesus...provided that we take the time to recognize that he is on the journey with us and always willing to give us direction.

Perhaps this time of self-isolation and quarantine, has given us all an opportunity to get to know the Lord more intimately...not just the Jesus of history but the Christ of faith....and to listen to his guidance and directions.

Perhaps we are spending some more meaningful time in prayer, reading the scriptures, recognizing his presence working through kindness of others, seeing his holy touch as we watch a sunrise or gaze at the stars, and ultimately recognizing his loving presence to us in the Eucharist even virtually....

All of these can help us stay in the right direction. On the roads we travel, Jesus is with us, he guides us, directs us, sometimes challenges us...and he asks us: "What are you running from, where are you running to. He constantly nudges us to look for signs of his presence in the good times and especially in our brokenness.

May these Easter days as we "break bread" in our homes....as we break bread together at our televised Eucharists, help us encounter Jesus in all of the roads we travel, in every moment - from the rising of the sun to its setting...remembering always that even Jesus' heart burns with love whenever he hears us asking for directions.

A NOTE FROM FATHER JOHN ABOUT SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Have you ever heard the expression, *Spiritual Communion*?

The expression *Spiritual Communion* has not been a regular part of our Catholic vocabulary in the recent past, but it is a practice in the Roman Catholic Church.



Saint Jean Marie Vianney, who lived in France in the 17th and 18th centuries and who is the patron saint of parish priests said, "If we are deprived of Sacramental Communion, let us replace it, as far as we can, by Spiritual Communion, which we can make every moment; for we ought to have always a burning desire to receive the good God."

"When you do not receive Communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a Spiritual Communion, which is a most beneficial practice," wrote Saint Teresa of Jesus, "by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." Saint Teresa of Jesus was a mystic from Spain who lived in the 16th century.

The great theologian and Doctor of the Church Saint Thomas Aquinas (13th century) described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the most holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive him in sacramental Communion.

Certainly, these weeks - as we deal with the Coronavirus - have seen the necessity for Spiritual Communion as we find ourselves self-isolating and in quarantine situations.

Spiritual Communion requires the same disposition as the actual reception of the Sacrament and a turning to Jesus with the heart.

One of the most popular prayers of Spiritual Communion is one composed by Saint Alphonsus Liguori (an Italian moral theologian) in the 1700s:

*My Jesus,
I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I desire to receive
You into my soul.
Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself
wholly to You.
Never permit me to be separated from You.
Amen.*

In these days when we are not be able to attend Mass, let us rely on the wisdom of Saints Jean Marie Vianney, Thomas Aquinas, Teresa of Jesus, and Alphonsus Liguori. May their intercession help us all during this challenging time. Holy Saints of God, pray for us!

AMBS TEACHERS RESPOND TO VIRTUAL LEARNING

In last week's bulletin, we shared with you some of the things going on in the elementary school classrooms of the Academy of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Here are some of examples of the instruction that is happening in the Middle School.

Ms. Denise Wetzel, who teaches Middle School Science, reports that “as far as online science classes go, students have been given interactive white board lessons, virtual labs, virtual dissections, review games, videos to observe, and slideshow presentations.”

“We have also watched the Stations of the Cross together, besides the Liturgies. Middle school students had an assignment to choose four Stations and reflect on their meaning and the impact it has on them, using Google slides.”

Ms. Wetzel also took the opportunity to join the AMBS Kindergarten/Transitions class as their mystery reader on Tuesday, April 21. “I chose a book about Earth Day which is observed this year on April 22.”

Mr. Robert Harrison, the Middle School Mathematics Teacher, says that his students are working hard on a variety of on-line lessons. Each week, students “read the online presentation, complete “classwork”, check their understanding with an electronically supplied answer key, and contact me directly if they need further clarification of the lesson. Then, they complete a mandatory homework assignment and submit it via e-mail for credit. We gather around the webcams in our homes to ask and answer questions on the course material. For most students, this has proven to be a satisfactory way to acquire the math skills necessary for their continued progress.”

“It may seem that the teacher’s world, which formerly revolved around the classroom “Smartboard” and the office copy machine, now centers on the personal computer, webcam, and scanning machine,” said Mr. Harrison. “But in truth, our focus has always been, and will continue to be, on the well-being of the student. We continue to provide individual assistance as the need arises, and we regularly monitor how our students are faring in this very different learning environment.”

Meanwhile, **Mrs. Stephanie Borghi** “has been utilizing Zoom, Google Classroom, Quizlet, YouTube, and other forms of multimedia to keep my students engaged and learning Spanish. Studying a world language over the computer is different for every grade level and I implement different tools for each group to keep them learning on their own levels. Also, using Zoom has allowed me to share my screen with students and use a white-board , which makes it very similar to what we would be doing in class!”



Church of the Most Blessed Sacrament Giving Tuesday Food Drive – May 5, 2020



The Church of the Most Blessed Sacrament will join the rest of the country in its annual celebration of Giving Tuesday and Cinco de Mayo by conducting a parish-wide food drive to benefit the St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry at Holy Trinity Parish in Hackensack.

As you know, St. Vincent DePaul is the food pantry that our parish has been serving for some time. Like pantries everywhere, it has been hit especially hard since the start of the Covid-19 outbreak. Food donations have drastically declined over the past few weeks as church services have been cancelled and people remain at home. At the same time, the need for food has increased dramatically as so many more people are struggling with the economic ramifications of the quarantine in our area. The St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry serves the entire population of the greater Bergen County area. No one is turned away.

WHAT IS NEEDED?

Non-perishable items only. The biggest needs are boxes of cereal and canned protein items such as canned tuna, salmon, anchovies, fruit and vegetables, pasta and sauce, soup, rice and the like.

WHEN IS THE DROP-OFF?

Donations will be accepted on Tuesday, May 5 between 3:00-5:00 pm in the parking lot of the Church of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Everything that is received will be loaded on trucks and driven directly to the St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry in Hackensack for distribution later that week.


HOW WILL THE DROP-OFF BE SAFELY ACCOMPLISHED?

Parishioners are asked to place donated items in the trunk of their car, and to wear protective masks while coming to MBS to drop them off. This is for the safety of all, particularly the volunteers who will be assisting.

When parishioners arrive at the drop-off station, they will be asked to “pop” open their trunk (or leave it unlocked so it can be opened without anyone having to exit their car) and a volunteer will unpack the food donation being made.
