Core Course: Introduction to the Catholic Faith

In the documents of Vatican II, the baptized are called to holiness and to greater understanding of their unique role in building the Kingdom of God. An informational and enriching introduction to the Catholic faith and theology, this course will enable you to take greater responsibility in promoting the life and mission of the Church. Using the *United States Catholic Catechism for Adults* as a primary text, this course will explore six core areas and will serve as a good foundation for those who seek to continue theological studies or develop theological competency for ministry. Theology is a fascinating and vital subject that challenges those who study it to think critically and personally about human existence, the world we live in and our relationship with God and one another. It is recommended (but not required) as a first course for those new to theological study.

Course Content

Unit 1: Faith Development

Unit 2: Scripture

Unit 3: The Creed/ Jesus Christ

Unit 4: The Church

Unit 5: Sacraments, Liturgy and Prayer

Unit 6: Morality

Course Format

- Seven weeks in duration, with one week for orientation.
- Typically 15-20 students in each course.
- In addition to assigned readings from *United States Catholic Catechism for Adults*, additional lecture material provided online.
- Supplemental readings are provided to encourage further exploration of topic, internet links provided for all readings.
- Written assignments (150-200 words) required.
- Facilitator-moderated chat sessions with students in course.

Required Texts

- Participants in this course must have their own copy of the [United States Catholic Catechism for Adults](#) from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. This book is available to read online, or it can be purchased in paper or electronic form.

Dates: Offered each session- April 22- June 7, 2019; June 17- August 2, 2019; September 2- October 18, 2019; October 14- November 29, 2019; January 13- February 21, 2020; February 24- April 10, 2020.

What To Expect

The course requires about **five** hours per week. You engage the course at the times that fit best with your other obligations.

- Required reading: approx. 1-2 hours.
- Written discussion of material online: approx. 1-2 hours.
- Live “chat” discussion of material: 1 hour at time set by course facilitator.
- A course participant who successfully completes the course earns 35 contact hours of continuing education and receives a certificate of completion.

Weekly group discussion of readings/ chats

The live chat component of the course is often participants’ favorite part of their experience. The facilitator set time, typically in the evening after work.

If you cannot attend the live chats, there are ways to meet this course requirement.

How To Register

1. Go to website mcgrath.nd.edu
2. Click on text “Online Courses” on the white, top navigation bar.
3. Click on the box “STEP Online Courses” for courses in English.
4. Scroll down and click on the box “Courses and Registration.”
5. Search for the title of the course you’re taking. Upcoming courses are in the top box and all others can be found listed below.
