

Introductory Prayers

Sign of the cross - In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Opening Prayer: *The opening prayer varies according to the day. You will find the opening prayer at the beginning of the day’s the rosary page*

Apostles Creed - I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Our Father - Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

3 Hail Mary... Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory be... Glory be to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Fatima Prayer - *O my Jesus, forgive us of our sins. Save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls into heaven, especially those in most need of thy mercy. Amen.*

Apparition Rosary for the Holy Souls of Purgatory

Opening Prayer: Oh, Our Lady of Guadalupe, mystical rose, make intercession for Holy Church, especially for the penitent church in purgatory and for the families who grieve their loss. Protect the Sovereign Pontiff, help all those who invoke thee in their necessities, and since thou art the ever Virgin Mary and Mother of the true God, obtain for us from thy most holy Son the grace of keeping our faith, sweet hope in the midst of the bitterness of life, burning charity and the precious gift of final perseverance. Amen.

First Miraculous Apparition



Reader: At dawn on December 9, 1531, Juan Diego, began his journey to the Church in Tlatelolco to attend catechism class and Mass. As he was passing Tepeyac Hill, he saw a brilliant light on the summit and heard the strains of celestial music from songbirds. Then he heard a feminine voice call him by name in his Native language of Nahuatl and asking him to ascend the hill. When he reached the top he saw a beautiful woman bathed in golden beams. The Blessed Virgin Mary was standing in a glorious light. She told him she was the Virgin Mary, Mother of the true God. She said “I am the Virgin Mary, Mother of the one true God, of Him who gives life. He is Lord and Creator of heaven and of earth. I desire that there be built a temple at this place where I want to manifest Him, make Him known, give Him to all people through my love, my compassion, my help, and my protection. I truly am your merciful Mother, your Mother and the Mother of all who dwell in this land, and of all mankind, of all those who love me, of those who cry to me, and of those who seek and place their trust in

me. Here I shall listen to their weeping and their sorrows. I shall take them all to my heart, and I shall cure their many sufferings, afflictions, and sorrows. So, run now to Tenochtitlan and tell the Lord Bishop all that you have seen and heard.”

Prayer - Our Lady of Guadalupe, we thank you for your first apparition to Blessed Juan Diego when you revealed that you are the Purest Virgin, Mary, Mother of the True God and Mother of all mankind. We thank you that you bear witness to your love, your compassion, your aid and your protection for all who would love you, trust you, and invoke your help. Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Guadalupe, please take to your Son Our Lord Jesus Christ our fervent prayers for those both known and unknown to us who have died. That they may be released from purgatory and finally enter into the presence of God. Amen.

Second Miraculous Apparition



Reader: Juan Diego traveled to the palace of the Franciscan Bishop Zumarrago. The Bishop was reluctant to believe Juan Diego's story but asked Juan to visit again. Juan returned to Tepeyac Hill where he found the Blessed Virgin waiting for him. He told her of his failure. She bade him return to the Bishop the next day and repeat her wishes saying “Listen, little son. There are many I could send. But you are the one I have chosen for this task. So, tomorrow morning, go back to the Bishop. Tell him it is the ever-holy Virgin Mary, Mother of God who sends you, and repeat to him my great desire for a church in this place.”

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, my Queen and my Mother, we I thank you for your second apparition to Blessed Juan Diego when, upon his return from the Bishop’s house, he knelt in humiliation and defeat before you since he was unable to accomplish your mission. We thank you for the courage and encouragement you gave to Blessed Juan Diego to make a second appeal to the Bishop. Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Guadalupe, give to us courage and encouragement to follow through on this weeklong prayer sacrifice for the souls in purgatory. So that even now, as we pray, souls are being released from purgatory and are at this moment being crowned as saints in Heaven. Amen.

Third Miraculous Apparition



Reader: Juan Diego called on the Bishop for a second time. The Bishop requested that the Lady give him a sign. Juan reported to the Lady that evening and she promised to give him a sign to take to the Bishop the following morning. Upon his return home, Juan Diego found his uncle, Juan Bernardino, gravely ill. Instead of meeting the Blessed Virgin the next day, he stayed home to care for his dying uncle.

All Pray: Our Lady of Guadalupe, we thank you for your third apparition to Blessed Juan Diego when, after this unsuccessful attempt to have a temple built, you continued to pursue him. Our Lady of Guadalupe, reach out to us here today as we implore your assistance for our loved ones in purgatory and all souls who await entrance into Heaven. In faithfulness we will not falter or be discouraged. For we put all our hope in your power as the Queen of Heaven, forever our Mother. Amen

Fourth Miraculous Apparition



Reader; Two days later, on December 12, Juan Diego woke up early to bring a priest from the church to his dying uncle to perform the last rite. During his travels, the Lady stopped Juan Diego. She listened as Juan spoke about his uncle. Then she said, "It is well, littlest and dearest of my sons, but now listen to me. Do not let anything afflict you and be not afraid of illness or pain. Am I not here who am your Mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Are you not in the crossing of my arms? Is there anything else you need? Do not fear for your uncle for he is not going to die. Be assured... he is already well."

The Blessed Virgin told him to climb to the top of the hill. She said he would find many flowers blooming there, which he was to cut and bring to her. Juan Diego knew no flowers

had ever bloomed before on the summit but to his shock, he discovered a marvelous garden of blossoms. Placing them in his tilma, he brought the flowers to the Lady, who rearranged them and told him to take them to the Bishop saying, "You see, little son, this is the sign I am sending to the Bishop. Tell him that now he has his sign, he should build the temple I desire in this place so that I may console the suffering and that they may come to know my Son. Remember, little son, that you are my trusted ambassador, and this time the Bishop will believe all that you tell him." Juan Diego stood before Bishop Zumarraga for the third time. He opened his tilma to show the Bishop the sign and the flowers cascaded to the floor. The bishop fell to his knees as on the tilma appeared the portrait of the Blessed Virgin, just as Juan Diego had previously described her.

All Pray: - Our Lady of Guadalupe, my Queen and my Mother, we thank you for your fourth apparition to Blessed Juan Diego when you ordered him to pick the roses. You arranged them in his tilma and left your image printed when the roses were released. Through this image, remind us always that you are our Mother, and that we are safe in the hollow of your mantle. Hear our cry when we ask that the souls of those we loved so much here on earth and all the souls in purgatory make quick reparation for their sins. Release them into heaven. Embrace our persistence in this effort as it is in love and for love that we pray and beg your intercession. Release them into heaven. Amen.

Fifth Miraculous Apparition



Reader: Earlier that same day, December 12, the Blessed Virgin had also appeared to Juan's uncle, Juan Bernardino, and restored him to health. Juan Diego was at that time fifty-seven years old; his uncle was sixty-eight. Juan Bernardino told his nephew that the Blessed Virgin appeared to him and told him her image was to be known as "Santa Maria de Guadalupe." She has been known by this title for five centuries.

All Pray: Our Lady of Guadalupe, my mother, into your hands joined in prayer, take our prayers, petitions and hopes, and present them to Jesus on our behalf. Remembering the love and care your hands rendered to Him, He will not refuse what they hold now, even though they are from sinners like us. We pray that just as you looked into the face of Juan Diego and his Uncle Bernadino, you would look into the face of those we have loved so much here on earth and have since passed away. Look into the face of all the suffering souls in purgatory. Take their hand and escort them into the presence of your Son. Amen.

The Hail Holy Queen (The Salve Regina)

All Pray: Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus, O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

O God, whose only begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life. Grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating on these mysteries of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe, we may imitate the love that they contain and obtain the hope that they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Joyful Mysteries for the Holy Souls in Purgatory

Opening Prayer: Almighty, Eternal God, because it is Your will that we pray for the holy souls in purgatory, we offer up this Joyful Rosary for those dearly departed. As we begin this prayer sacrifice, we beg of You, erase their guilt through the overly rich merits of Your Most Beloved Son, and through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Have mercy on them, we beseech You, O Lord. We pray also that the fiery and sweet strength of Your love may absorb our souls from all things that are under heaven. That we may die for love of Your love, as You died for love of our love. Amen

First Joyful Mystery: The Annunciation



Scripture: The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Highest, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her. (Luke 1:26-33, 38)

Prayer: - Our Lady of Guadalupe, mother of the Church Suffering, with your "yes" you have opened heaven's ways; you have achieved the will of the Father. You will be blessed forever: your intercession for the holy souls in purgatory is heard in Heaven, because you have accepted God's plan. We pray that, like you, we can say "yes" to the Father in every instance He asks it of us. Help us to be humble and obedient to God's will and to always remember our brothers and sisters in purgatory who await the grand entrance into heaven. We pray also for those who mourn the death of a relative or a friend and feel that with this loss their lives are incomplete. Show them that they have a Mother who loves them and will never leave them and that they have nothing to fear. Amen

Second Joyful Mystery: The Visitation



Scripture: During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." (Luke 1:39-45)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, help us to bring Christ to others and give them the hope of Eternal Life, like you brought Jesus to Elizabeth. Dearest Mother Mary, Salvation of those who hope in you, we ask you to intercede for us and for the holy souls of purgatory. That we may receive the gift of burning charity in praying for the dead and that they may be loosed from their sin and finally obtain the joys of heaven. We pray also for those who mourn, who have downcast hearts. We pray that they may know in full confidence that you are able to lift them out of their grief. You said "Am I not here who is your Mother? What else do you need?". Show yourself to them and bring them the lifesaving hope of your Son, Jesus. Amen.

Third Joyful Mystery: The Nativity



Scripture: While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Now there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear. The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." (Luke 2: 6-12)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, most Holy Ark of the Covenant, you carried the Son of God in your womb and brought him into this world to reclaim the lost. Look down upon the suffering souls in purgatory and intercede for them. That our Lord may remember not their offenses but be mindful of His loving mercy, which is from all eternity. We pray for those who mourn. That you, Our Lady of Guadalupe, may fill their empty hearts with bouquets of beautiful memories of their loved ones. That they may know that the existing love that burns in their hearts comes from their Creator, and it is that same love that will lead them to Him. Amen

Fourth Joyful Mystery: The Presentation in the Temple



Scripture: Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." (Luke 2:25-32)

Prayer: - Oh, Mother of Compassion, Our Lady of Guadalupe, just as Simeon longed to see the face of the Messiah, you know the intense longing the souls being purified in purgatory have for that same desire. They long for God's eternal embrace. Intercede for them, Mother of Consolation that they may finally attain Heaven and one day we may all rejoice in Paradise together forever and ever. Dearest Mother, we pray also for those who have lost a loved one and are hurting in grief. Lift their eyes so that they may catch a glimpse of eternity and be comforted by the promise of heaven. Amen.

Fifth Joyful Mystery: The Finding in the Temple



Scripture: Each year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. (Luke 2:41-50)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, take our prayers to our Heavenly Father, that He may know that we do not pray alone and that we have an intercessor in you, His beloved Mother, whom He will never refuse. Hear our cries for the faithful departed especially those we loved so much here on earth. We give our all through your hands, Our Lady of Guadalupe, that you may set free whatever soul you please, according to your heavenly wisdom and mother's love for them. We also pray, dearest Mother, for those who mourn. Cover them with your great mantle of love. Help them find your Son Jesus just as you found him in the temple, that He may give their weary hearts rest and their minds sound sleep. Amen.

Have mercy on them, we beseech You, O Lord. We pray also that the fiery and sweet strength of Your love may absorb our souls from all things that are under heaven. That we may die for love of Your love, as You died for love of our love. Amen.

First Sorrowful Mystery: The Agony in the Garden



Scripture: They went to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, “Sit here while I pray.” He took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be distressed and agitated. And he said to them, “I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and keep awake.” And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass from him. He said, “Abba, Father, for you all things are possible; remove this cup from me; yet, not what I want, but what you want.” He came and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, “Simon, are you asleep? Could you not keep awake one hour? Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.” Again, he went away and prayed, saying the same words. And once more he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were very heavy; and they did not know what to say to him. He came a third time and said to them, “Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? Enough! The hour has come; the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Get up, let us be going. See, my betrayer is at hand.” (Mark 14:32-42)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Queen of the Rosary, we beseech you, by the immense grief which your Divine Son Jesus felt in the garden, intercede for the souls in purgatory, and especially that soul which is most destitute of prayers and most lacking of earthly loved ones. Bring them to the glory of your Son, there to praise and bless Him forever. Our Lady of Guadalupe, for all those who awoke this morning to the loneliness of bereavement. Those who are living an unaccustomed quietness of a life now, thought to be, incomplete. That they may feel the warmth of the One who has already passed from death to life, for the very purpose of making it possible for their loved one to pass from death to life into God’s Kingdom. Amen.

Second Sorrowful Mystery: The Scourging at the Pillar



Scripture: Pilate then called together the chief priests, the leaders, and the people, and said to them, “You brought me this man as one who was perverting the people; and here I have examined him in your presence and have not found this man guilty of any of your charges against him. Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us. Indeed, he has done nothing to deserve death. I will therefore have him flogged and release him. Then they all shouted out together, “Away with this fellow! Release Barabbas for us!” This was a man who had been put in prison for an insurrection that had taken place in the city, and for murder. (Luke 23:13-19)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Queen of the Heaven, you did suffer with Jesus his Passion, accepting the office of Mother of mankind at the foot of the Cross. Behold Mother the children in purgatory whom He commended to your care. Behold the souls ransomed with the Blood of the Son, shed in His cruel scourging. We beseech you now, intercede for the deliverance of the souls in purgatory into the Presence of your Son. Also, for those who mourn we pray, Our Lady of Guadalupe, that you may be the vessel God uses to bring them into His light. That through you they may know their God and know that He will never leave them or forsake them. That they may know that there will be beauty for ashes on the other side of this grief. Amen.

Third Sorrowful Mystery: The Crowning with Thorns



Scripture: Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the praetorium, and they gathered the whole battalion before him. And they stripped him and put a scarlet robe upon him, and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on his head, and put a reed in his right hand. And kneeling before him they mocked him, saying, “Hail, King of the Jews!” And they spat upon him, and took the reed and struck him on the head. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the robe, and put his own clothes on him, and led him away to crucify him. (Matthew 27:27-31)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Behold the just suffering in purgatory, who ask to be remembered by you. Mother of mankind, speak to thy Son on behalf of those we commend to you now, by the Precious Blood which your Son Jesus shed in His bitter crowning with thorns. That they may be speedily released from pain and admitted to Paradise. To the company of Jesus, all the angels and saints and you, our precious Mother. Our Lady of Guadalupe, to you we also entrust those who mourn. That they may know your promise to be with them in this day of trouble and your promise to hold them close in the fold of your mantle. That if they cannot find Our Lord in the darkness of this grief, you may lead them to Him. Amen.

Fourth Sorrowful Mystery: The Carrying of the Cross



Scripture: Carrying his own cross, he went out to the place of the Skull (which in Aramaic is called Golgotha). ¹⁸ There they crucified him, and with him two others—one on each side and Jesus in the middle. Pilate had a notice prepared and fastened to the cross. It read: JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS. ²⁰ Many of the Jews read this sign, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and the sign was written in Aramaic, Latin and Greek. ²¹ The chief priests of the Jews protested to Pilate, “Do not write ‘The King of the Jews,’ but that this man claimed to be king of the Jews.” Pilate answered, “What I have written, I have written.” (John 19:17-22)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, we beseech you, by the Precious Blood which your Divine Son Jesus shed through the streets of Jerusalem when He carried the cross upon His sacred shoulders. Intercede for the deliverance of the souls in purgatory so that on the throne of glory which awaits them, they may magnify Our Lord and bless Him forever. Our Lady of Guadalupe, help our brothers and sisters in Christ who mourn the loss of a loved one. Let them know that God’s eye is upon them even in the midst of this suffering. That they may know that nothing is wasted in this life especially not a grief that is such a witness to love. Lead them into the beauty of lifesaving truth. Amen.

Fifth Sorrowful Mystery: The Crucifixion and Death



Scripture: Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.” (Acts 1:6-11).

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, at the Ascension Jesus accomplished the work of redemption. Today, with determined hearts we ask you, Our Mother, to intercede for the souls in purgatory. Especially those we loved so much here on this earth. Let them finally receive the fullness of the reward of your Son’s sacrifice. 
Second Luminous Mystery: The Wedding Feast at Cana



Scripture: On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So, they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom¹⁰ and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. (John 2:1-11)

Prayer: Our Lady of Guadalupe, intercede for us just as you interceded for that couple in Cana. Release our loved ones into heaven that their stay in purgatory may be lessened. We know Our Lord will not deny you anything. Give us the peace of knowing, at least, that Our Lord has already forgiven our dearly departed of their sins. 
