Scar Tissue

“Would you like to see my scar?” We hear this question from some people who have had surgery, scraped the road from their motorcycle, or suffered a wound in war. Sometimes they are more anxious to show it than we are to see it.

The reverse happens too. We would like to see a scar, but the person—for private reasons—chooses not to show it.

We all carry scars. Some are physical and quite visible. Others are well concealed. Some scars are emotional. They make themselves known even when we wish they did not. And some of our scars make us who we are. They are signs of our resilience, of the ill-intent of enemies, of moments of foolishness, or times of unimaginable bravery. For some of us, our biography is the story of our scars.

St. Paul tells the Galatians, “I bear the marks of Jesus on my body.” Paul had his share of physical and emotional pain, and he carried scars. They were not signs of hurt and pain, not signs of foolishness or bravery, not signs of illness or treachery. They were signs of Jesus. Because of Jesus, Paul endured all things. His scars told less about the tenacity of Paul, and more about the faithfulness of Christ.

Where are your scars? What do they represent? Who do they represent? Do you conceal them? Or do you ask, “Would you like to see my scar?”

To all who donated their children's outgrown clothing to our homeless and poor, thank you. The clothes were delivered to The Providence


Rescue Mission for distribution.

LAST RITES

For many people of a certain age the term "Last Rites" brings thoughts of Last Chance or Last Hope.

Which is probably why the Bishops at the 2nd Vatican Council restored the proper name to this Sacramental Anointing as it was seen and used in the early church. See the Epistle of St. James chapter 5, verses 14 and following.

Extreme Unction is now correctly called The Sacrament of the Sick and is to be prayerfully administered whenever a person is in need of the Healing & Grace of Christ in their illness, and not to be delayed to the final hours or moments of life.

So if you, or a family member, are about to be hospitalized for surgery, or perhaps admitted to Hospice care, then by all means, please call the Parish Office to arrange for this Anointing to be given.

It may even be offered to you here at Church before you enter the hospital. Please do not delay in asking for this wonderful gift of Grace from our Loving God.
