**Strengthening Our Bond With
Pope Francis**

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In our continuing catechesis on *prayer*, we now consider its essential characteristics.

Prayer involves our entire being yearning for some "other" beyond ourselves.

Specifically Christian prayer is born from the realization that the "other" we are seeking has been revealed in the tender face of Jesus, who teaches us to call God "Father", and wants personally to enter into relationship with us.

In his farewell discourse at the Last Supper, Jesus no longer calls his disciples servants but *friends*.

When we commune with God in prayer, we need not be fearful, for he is a friend, a trusted ally. Whatever our situation, or however poorly we may think of ourselves, God is always faithful, and willing to embrace us in mercy.

We see this unconditional love on Calvary, for the Lord never stops loving, even to the end.

Let us seek to pray by entering into this mystery of God's unending Covenant with us. This is the burning heart of every Christian prayer: entrusting ourselves to the loving and merciful arms of our heavenly Father. *Pope Francis, General Audience, Library of the Apostolic Palace, Wednesday, May 13, 2020.*

Simple and Effective Ways to Evangelize as a Catholic

- 1....Set time apart daily for God. Don't be afraid to tell others you do that.
- 2...Smile a lot. It makes you happy. It also makes others happy. It's a great witness to your joy.
- 3...Say "Thank you" as often as you can. Expressing gratitude makes you more appreciative of what you have. Gratitude is a beautiful virtue. It helps make you, and those you thank, happy!
- 4...Always remember, "Be not afraid". It is the most mentioned phrase in the Bible.
- 5...Spend some time in silent reflection. Start with five minutes a day. Try to visualize darkness, calmness, nothingness, peace. Block out other thoughts. God will "break-in" when He wants. You will recognize him. - Diocese of Salinas

Gospel Reading John 14:15-21

Jesus promises his disciples that he will send them another advocate, the Spirit of truth.



Today's Gospel is a continuation of last week's Gospel: Jesus is speaking to his disciples at the Last Supper. In today's reading Jesus offers encouragement to his disciples, who will soon see him crucified. He reassures them that even though he will leave them, he will not abandon them. Instead he will send them the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, through whom the disciples will continue to live in union with Jesus.

Jesus uses the term *Advocate* to describe the Holy Spirit, whom the disciples will receive. Another word used to describe the Holy Spirit is *Paraclete*, a legal term meaning "one who offers defense for another." Note that Jesus says that he will send "another Advocate." Jesus himself is the first advocate, interceding for his disciples with the Father.

In today's reading Jesus contrasts his impending departure with the permanence of the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus will leave to return to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples.

Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will come to know and appreciate the unity of the Son and the Father. They will also understand that they too participate in the communion between the Father and the Son: "On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you" (John 14:20).

Today's reading is one example of the contrast that John's Gospel presents between the community of disciples, to whom God will reveal himself, and the unbelieving world, which will remain in darkness. The unbelieving world cannot accept the "Spirit of truth," whom the disciples will receive. Only through the Spirit will God's revelation and love be known. - Sunday Connection

As you may recall, our parish's goal was \$423,714.00. Out of our more than 1700 registered families, 230 families made one time gifts or pledges that totaled \$390,209.00 (92%). **With the one time gifts that were made and the amount fulfilled on the pledges, a combined total of 124,838.00 has been paid.**

A short time ago we received our initial parish share check, for the first quarter of 2020, in the amount of 47,187.65.

Tuition Assistance

In accordance with Diocesan Policies, **Tuition Assistance is only for students in grades K-8.** With particular permission and authorization from the Bishop, tuition assistance may be available for students who attend one of the Catholic High Schools here in the diocese. ***The premise of the Catholic School Tuition Assistance Program is that financial assistance is based on need.*** Families requesting assistance must fulfill the following requirements:

- *Must be registered in the parish (at least one full year.)
- *Must attend Mass on a weekly basis.
- *Must use the budget envelope system.
- *Must show family involvement in parish programs/ministry.
- *Must submit the FACTS form through the school's Financial Aid Office
