Easter SUNDAY APRIL 12, 2020

This is the day the Lord has made;
let us rejoice and be glad.

Psalms 118:24

If Christmas is the “most wonderful time of the year,” then Easter is the most joyous, glorious, awesome time of the year! Really? Today’s readings don’t exactly brim over with the kind of holiday cheer we find at Christmas—except for the responsorial psalm, which admittedly rings with gleeful joy. But otherwise, not so much. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter gives a dry, condensed rendering of the story of Jesus to a group of Gentiles in Caesarea. The Colossians reading actually does have us looking forward to glory. Most underwhelming, though, is the Gospel proclamation of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we want to hear about angels and earthquakes and trumpets and glory, we hear about a dark, silent, empty tomb. This Easter Sunday story from John’s Gospel is startling in its emptiness. Like Peter in the story, we must enter into this mystery.

THE MYSTERY OF EMPTINESS

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! This Paschal greeting is customary in Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches on Easter Sunday. Then there is Saint Augustine’s acclamation of joy: We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song! However you express it, Easter is the time for rejoicing because Jesus Christ, our friend and brother, is risen from the dead. And yet today’s scriptures are less joyful than one would expect for the most important feast in the Christian calendar. Perhaps we are being asked to look deeper into the mystery of the Resurrection, just as Peter went into the tomb to look deeper into the mystery of its

emptiness.

Mary Magdalene, who loved the Lord so much that she risked everything, possibly even her life, to go to the tomb before daybreak, finds the stone rolled away and assumes that someone has taken Jesus’ body. Frightened and sad, she runs to tell Peter and John. They all run back to the tomb, but what do they expect to see? Peter enters the tomb and sees. John enters, sees, and believes. But what does he believe? Scripture states, “For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead” (John 20:9). They went home, not really knowing what had happened. But John “believed” something.

SOMETHING HAPPENED

What do we believe? Somewhere between that Easter morning and Peter’s confident teaching about Jesus in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, something (the Risen Christ) happened. Peter has evolved from his bewilderment into a witness to the Resurrection.

What are we to find in the empty tomb? Maybe the Colossians reading has an answer. By entering the empty tomb of our lives to seek the Lord, we see, we believe, we die, to be raised with Christ. “For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God” (Colossians 3:3). And we will rise in glory with him.

† **Easter Sunday**—Mass will be livestreamed from the church at 10:00 a.m. in English and at 12:00 p.m. in Spanish.

How To Prepare For The Celebration Of Online Masses:

Prepare Externally:

1. Prepare an altar table with candle and a crucifix.
2. Respond and participate in the online Mass. If possible, follow the ritual of standing, kneeling and being seated, as we do in church.
3. Have the Act of Spiritual Communion ready.
4. Invite the whole family and, together, join in our celebration of online Mass.

Prepare Internally:

1. Have a moment of silence.
2. Call the family together and say a prayer.
3. During Communion, recite the **Act of Spiritual Communion** together.
4. After the online Mass, recite the Prayer to St. Michael.
5. Go to love and share the Lord; share the online Mass—be a cyber missionary.

Mass Alternatives:

We recognize that having to cancel our daily and Sunday Masses has had a significant effect on many of you. We, too, are conflicted between our desire to continue ministering to you, while also balancing that with the necessity of keeping you healthy, as well as staying healthy ourselves. Following are some alternatives offered by the Archdiocese in lieu of Mass attendance:

† You may view Mass via livestream. Mass at Annunciation will be celebrated from the Chapel located in the Rectory. Weekday Mass will take place at 10:00 a.m.; there will be a Mass in English on Sunday at 10:00 a.m. and a Mass in Spanish on Sunday at 12:00 p.m. These Masses can be accessed via our website at: www.annunciationchurch.net or our Facebook page: [www.facebook.com/Annunciation Catholic Church](https://www.facebook.com/AnnunciationCatholicChurch). The weekday and Sunday Masses will be livestreamed from the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels via the LA Catholics Facebook page ([facebook.com/lacatholics](https://www.facebook.com/lacatholics)) and is also available on YouTube. Sunday Mass in English is streamed at 10:00 a.m. and the Sunday Mass in Spanish is streamed at 12:30 p.m. There is a daily Mass livestreamed from the Cathedral at 12:10 p.m. The website for EWTN also streams daily Mass. If you listen to Sirius XM radio, Mass is available on Channel 130 (EWTN) and Channel 129 (The Catholic Channel). Visit www.heartofthenation.org to locate your TV service provider and the channel that you can access to view Mass. If you do not have a subscription service, Channel 56 (DKOC) also broadcasts Mass. For additional information on additional Mass broadcasts on TV and radio, please visit lacatholics.org/emergency.

† If you do not view or listen to Mass on Sunday, you are encouraged to keep this day holy. Activities may include: reading the Gospels, praying with your family or friends, and making an act of spiritual communion.

I Cristo resucitó! ¡En verdad resucitó! Este saludo pascual es tradicional en la Iglesia católica oriental y ortodoxa y el Domingo de Pascua. Luego está la aclamación jubilosa de san Agustín: ¡Somos personas pascuales y el aleluya es nuestro canto! De la manera que lo exprese, la pascua es un tiempo para alegrarse porque Jesucristo, nuestro amigo y hermano, resucitó de la muerte. Y aun así las Escrituras de hoy son menos jubilosas de lo que uno esperaría para la celebración más importante en el calendario cristiano. Quizás se nos pide mirar más profundamente al misterio de la Resurrección, así como Pedro fue al sepulcro a ver más profundamente el misterio del sepulcro vacío.

María Magdalena, quien amaba mucho al Señor hasta arriesgar todo posiblemente su propia vida, para ir al sepulcro antes del amanecer, encontrando la piedra removida y asumir que alguien había robado el cuerpo de Jesús. Temerosa y triste, ella corre a decirle a Pedro y a Juan. Luego ellos corren hacia el sepulcro, ¿pero, que era lo que ellos esperaban ver? Pedro entra a la tumba y ve. Juan entra, ve y cree. Pero, ¿qué es lo que él cree? Las Escrituras lo dicen: “Y es que hasta entonces, los discípulos no habían entendido la Escritura, según la cual Jesús tenía que

resucitar de entre los muertos”. Fueron a casa, sin realmente saber lo que había pasado. Pero Juan “creyó” algo.

ALGO PASÓ

¿Qué creemos nosotros? En algún lugar entre esa mañana de Pascua y la enseñanza convencida de Pedro de la lectura del libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, algo (Cristo resucitado) pasó. Pedro maduró de su desconcierto hacia hacerse un testigo de la Resurrección.

¿Quiénes somos nosotros en la tumba vacía? Quizá la lectura a los colosenses tenga una respuesta. Al entrar a la tumba vacía de nuestras vidas y buscar al Señor, vemos, creemos, morimos, para resucitar con Cristo. “Han muerto, y su vida está escondida con Cristo en Dios” (Colosenses 3:3) Y resucitaremos en la gloria con él.

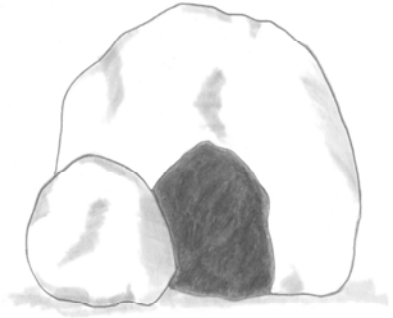


TRULY RISEN!

(Easter entrance antiphon)

All during Lent the first readings of the liturgy were drawn from the Old Testament and told stories of the family of those who came before Jesus. When Jesus rose on Easter the people who loved and followed him in his life became part of the new family known as Christians. On the Sundays of Easter we will read about their stories from the New Testament book called the Acts of the Apostles. You are one of these Christians. Each Easter, we have the chance to imagine ourselves standing at the empty tomb with the apostles. Together we believe that Jesus is not among the dead but is “truly risen” and with us today.
