Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

At what point in our lives do we stop sharing spontaneously?

At what point does sharing become labored, measured and difficult?

The Sound of Pride, the Berwick High School Band, has a two-week camp every July to begin preparations for the competition of the marching season. Mrs. McCarter, the staff, and the students put in long days during the two weeks.

The band members remain at school during the lunch break, bringing food from home. I was visiting during one lunch break and was surprised to see three of the students sharing their food easily and readily. Few words were spoken, mostly subtle gestures, barely perceptible movements of the head really, but permission was sought and given.

Their sharing was spontaneous, childlike, almost innocent, overwhelmingly generous. Whatever each had was shared, purely and simply. There was no measured exchange: I will give you my brownie for your potato chips.

Most of us, at one point in our lives, learned to share in the same manner. At some point, however, we lost the sense of spontaneity, of generosity. We probably lost these qualities simultaneously with the loss of innocence.

Sharing then became something measured, contractual. The ancient Romans developed this into actual contract law: you give so that I may give, you give that I may do, you do that I may give, you give that I may do.

The loss of a sense of spontaneous sharing negatively impacts what is designed as works of charity or donations. So, I no longer make a contribution for university education to benefit the common good, I donate to the university to guarantee the acceptance of my slightly underachieving grandchild.

This same dynamic has a negative impact on helping others: I help those who have helped me or definitely will do so some day.

Sharing is replaced by bartering. Is something lost?

Watching the three students share so spontaneously brought these and other thoughts to mind.

Is it possible that we also cease at some point to be spontaneous and generous with God? Is it possible that we also begin to barter with Him? Do we promise some donation to the Church or to the poor, provided that our petition is granted?

Is it possible to regain spontaneity and generosity in our sharing?

I would like to think so.
