# Quelques paroles de Monsieur le Cure

As I write this morning, preparations are underway for the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. In addition, as of now, I intend to attend the Chrism Mass tomorrow at the Cathedral.

The following days will be busy, but ever so meaningful. These days have been important to me for many years.

I was beginning the fifth grade when we moved to Cecilia. Because we lived across the street from the church, I began attending daily Mass on my own. At the pastor's invitation, I soon began serving Mass every day.

The ceremonies for the Triduum were considerably more complex than they are today. The use of Latin made them seem even more challenging.

Although I had not thought about these things from the past in many years, these memories came to mind because of a comment that someone made about how elaborate the Altars of Reposition were in some parishes. This elaborateness was the norm in those days, not the exception.

The Sisters of the Most Holy Sacrament in Cecilia would spend hours preparing the Altar of Reposition. A large white curtain was hung behind the designated altar. A flock of individual flowers in small containers of water were pinned to the curtain. The altar itself had a frontal and cloths, vases of fresh flowers, and a minimum of sixteen candles.

The repository, used only on this one occasion during the year, was centered with a suitable backdrop.

At the end of the Holy Thursday Mass the pastor carried the Blessed Sacrament, carefully wrapped in a humeral veil, through the church to the Altar of Reposition. Gentleman from the parish held a canopy over the Blessed Sacrament, two altar boys swung censers during the entire procession, other servers carried candles. The people knelt in great reverence and with heart-felt devotion.

As we do here, the parishioners maintained a vigil in front of the Altar of Reposition from the end of the Holy Thursday Mass until the Solemn Services of Good Friday at 3 the next day.

The Altars of Reposition and the ceremonies are considerably simpler, especially in smaller parishes. The essentials are the same now as then: The Lord Jesus Christ, true God and true Man, is present Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, under the appearance of bread.

If the externals are simpler, the faith should never be. If we really understood the Mystery, we would be at a loss as to how to adequately express it. There would not be enough flowers or incense in Berwick to convey the full meaning.

Hopefully, our love for the Lord Jesus will be tangible and visible.
