GODPARENTS AND SPONSORS:

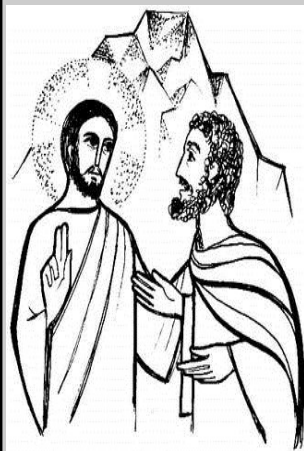

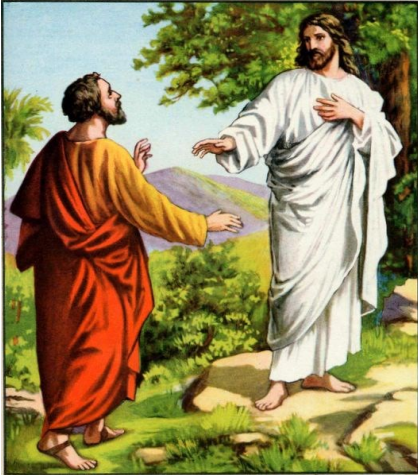

TO CARRY THE CROSS FREELY

Invited to be God's prophet, Jeremiah demurred, pointing to his young age and lack of experience, especially in public speaking. God, however, assured Jeremiah of his unfailing help, touching his mouth and promising him that he would be given the words to speak at the proper time. The reluctant prophet was tasked to preach to his countrymen regarding the impending destruction of Judah and Jerusalem brought about by their many sins and their worship of false gods.

Jeremiah's deep and abiding concern for the people of Judah and Jerusalem is met with ridicule and scorn. The prophet now cries out to God, claiming that he has become the laughingstock of many people and is even threatened with death. Worst of all, his situation has become intolerable since Jeremiah feels that the word of God has chained him. He cannot forget the Lord and he cannot refrain from speaking in his name. God's message has become like a fire burning in his heart.

While Jeremiah pictures a prophet bound by God's work, Jesus in the Gospel is the image of God's servant who freely accepts his impending passion, death, and resurrection. Jesus will thrice prophesy his paschal mystery. When he first makes this prophesy to his disciples, Peter remonstrates and warns Jesus against such end: "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you" (v 22).

Earlier, Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" (Mt. 16:13). Jesus appreciated Peter's answer and even commended him, reminding him that such answer actually came from the heavenly Father.

In the Gospel, after Peter glorifies Jesus as the Christ, Son of the living God, the Apostle turns into a devil. Jesus calls him a stumbling block because in Peter's design to shield Jesus from any form of suffering, Peter is unknowingly impeding God's plan.

Peter operates on a very human way in trying to protect Jesus from danger and harm. Peter and the other disciples get the surprise of their life when Jesus speaks beyond preserving one's life in this world. While the Apostles dream of a political Messiah or a military liberator, Jesus speaks to them of the cross that he is about to carry. Jesus tells them that the very symbol of sinfulness, shame, and dishonor will now be their badge of glory. And if they wish to follow him, the Apostles have to think according to God's way. The Apostles therefore need to carry their own cross as well.

As we pursue God's Word, it shall pursue us as well like what it did to Jeremiah. We also count on God's unfailing help as we prophesy in God's name. May we heed Jesus' summon to us to carry our cross as we strive to become his followers.

3) **Copy of Baptismal Certificate** (especially for those who were baptized outside of OLBS); If your child was baptized here at OLBS and you do not have a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate, you can obtain one for a fee of \$5.00.

FOR PRE-CONFIRMATION AND THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: You must have the following paperwork before turning in a registration form:

1) **Parents/Guardians must be a registered parishioner at OLBS.** They must attend mass regularly at the parish. For any exceptions, you will need to get Fr. Marvin's approval.

2) **Copy of Birth Certificate**

3) **Copy of Baptismal and First Holy Communion Certificate** (especially for those who were baptized and received 1st Communion outside of OLBS); If your child was baptized and received 1st Communion here at OLBS and you do not have a copy of your child's Certificate, you can obtain one for a fee of \$5.00.

WHAT IS PERPETUAL ADORATION?

Perpetual Adoration is a Eucharistic devotion whereby members of a given parish unite in taking hours of adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament (in most cases, exposed), both during the day and throughout the night, seven days a week.

WHY IS EXPOSITION IN THE MONSTRANCE PREFERRED?

To see Jesus visibly present under the appearance of the small white host is much more conducive to intimacy than hidden away in the tabernacle. Moreover, it adds an extra responsibility on the adorers to be sure to be faithful to the hours they are scheduled, since the suggested norm for having Jesus exposed in the monstrance is that there should be at least two adorers present, and He must never be left alone. Could not these words of our Lord be applied today: "Indeed, this is the will of My heavenly Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son, and believes in Him, shall have eternal life. Him I will raise up on the last day."

HOW DOES ONE SPEND AN HOUR BEFORE JESUS EXPOSED IN THE BLESSED SACRAMENT?

This hour Jesus wants you to spend with Him is spent any way you want. You may bring your own prayer books, use the books in the chapel, read the Bible, pray the rosary, or just sit and relax and enjoy the sweet peace that comes from simply being in the Presence of God. You may feel that you can't pray well. Don't let this discourage you. The mere fact that you take time out at a specific time each week to spend an hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament pleases Him very much and is in itself a prayer of great faith. Please remember that Perpetual Adoration is a parish is not just for a day, a week, a month, or a year. Rather, it is for **ALWAYS**. It is not temporary, but ongoing, lasting, permanent.
