#### Myth Number Seven:

##### If Children were Born in the Marriage, It Can't be Annulled

*The truth is that the Catholic Church considers and openness to children to be a natural and essential part of sacramental marriage, but whether any children were actually born or not has no bearing on the possibility of an annulment. If children were born, it is important that both parents live up to their natural and legal obligations to their children. It is a myth, however, that a marriage can't be annulled if the marriage resulted in children.*
