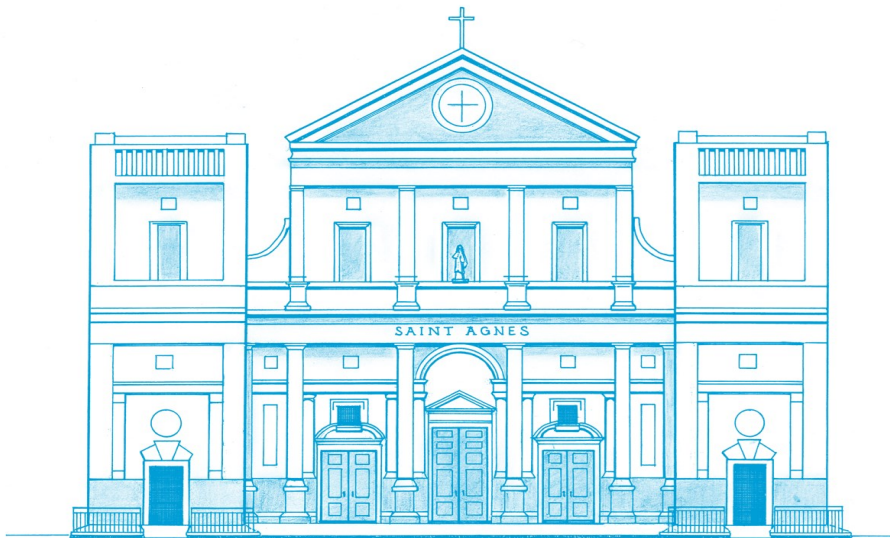

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

As Catholics, we believe that the Eucharist really is the Lord—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is not a symbolic gesture, but truly Him who we receive. Therefore, we must properly prepare, showing respect and reverence. How to do this?

- ◆ Be prepared by being in a state of grace. If you are in mortal sin, Church law says that you cannot receive the Eucharist. Make a plan to go to Confession.
- ◆ Be prepared by fasting 1 hour before receiving the Eucharist. This is Church law for all Catholics. Water and medicine are allowed. Question? Ask a priest.
- ◆ If you receive in the hand, make sure your hands are clean (no gloves!).
- ◆ **Consume the Eucharist immediately. For the safety of the Blessed Sacrament, you MUST consume the host immediately; you may not take the Eucharist back to the pew with you. If you cannot abide by this rule, do not present yourself for Communion.**
- ◆ Return to the pew, kneeling until the remaining hosts are returned to the Tabernacle. You are in the Presence of the Lord; kneeling at this time is important. If you have a physical disability, sitting is allowed.
- ◆ Take time to make your petitions and also offer Thanksgiving for graces received. This is your time to focus and intimately speak to the Lord/the Heavenly Father/the Holy Trinity.



**RCIA at St. Agnes
for Fall 2018**

The Church of St. Agnes is happy to announce a RCIA course for those interested in completing sacraments (Baptism, Confirmation) or converting to the Catholic faith.

RCIA, *the Rite for Christian Initiation for Adults*, covers all aspects of Catholic teaching: revelation, scripture, theology, sacraments, and commandments. We also welcome those who seek to deepen their knowledge of the faith.

Classes start on September 20th and will meet in the lower church hall on Thursdays at 6:45pm. After completing the course, students will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil at St. Agnes on April 20th, 2019.

for the holy souls in Purgatory and for the needs of Holy Church.”***

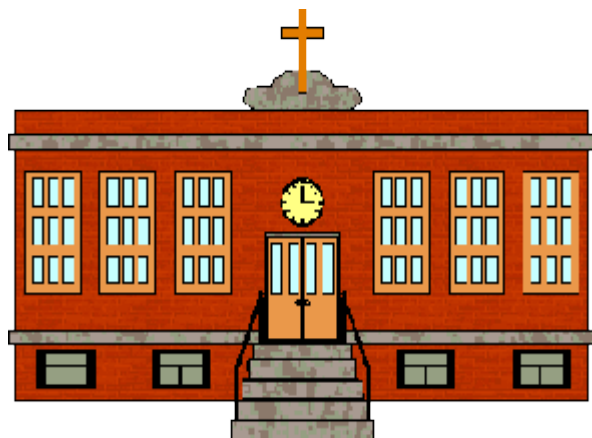

New! After-School Enrichment Programs at NY Catholic Schools

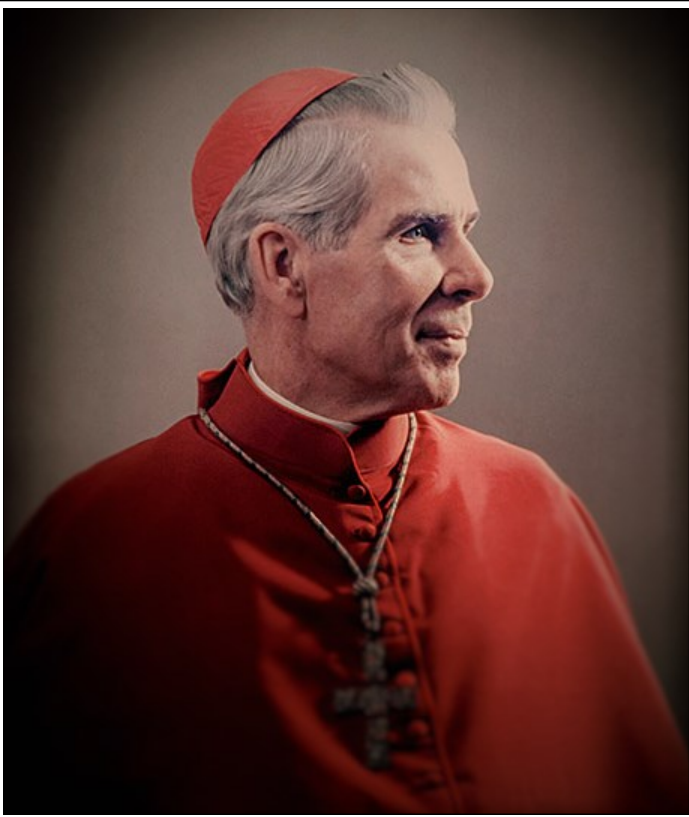
Beginning in September 2018, the Archdiocese of New York will launch enhanced After-School Enrichment Programs at 15 participating schools. The enhanced After-School Enrichment Programs' structure allows students time to play, work and learn in community with their peers in a safe, caring after-school environment affording peace of mind to parents whose schedules necessitate a later pick-up time each day. The additional, daily exposure each day to new activities infused with Catholic values and faith, will give children an edge in their development as thinkers, leaders and members of their communities. What you need to know:



- The Program at each participating school is overseen by a designated Program Director, working closely with faculty, staff, and other specialists to create an engaging, fun, and educational experience for students.
- After-School Enrichment Program provides students with an opportunity to engage in new activities after school, which may include Academic Clubs, Performing Arts Clubs, Sports, etc (options vary).
- Quiet time for students to do their homework and unstructured play time are also included.
- The program will generally be available to all full-time students in Grades K through 8 and run from Monday through Friday from 2:30 or 3:00pm to 6:00pm, except on days when schools are closed.
- Families who register for the After-School Enrichment Program will be charged a reasonable monthly or daily fee.

Note: offerings, schedules, food service and fees vary by school, please check with your school to confirm exact details.

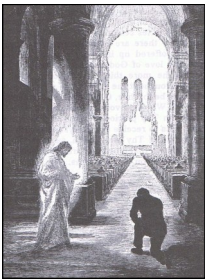


A Leader Worth Following

Genuflecting: where and when?



Before entering or leaving the pew, Catholics genuflect with their **right** knee touching the floor.* Many people also make the Sign of the Cross at this time. One should always acknowledge the Lord, by bowing their head or genuflecting, when crossing the church and passing the Tabernacle.

**If you are physically impaired, then bowing your head in the direction of the Tabernacle is the appropriate thing to do.*
