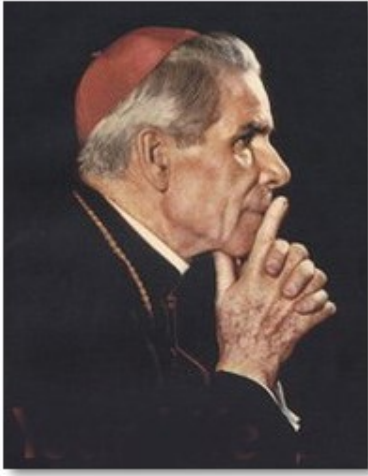

Lent is on the way: Plan now and be prepared

Ash Wednesday is less than two weeks away. Plan now so you can make the most of the season. Some ideas:

- **Invest in a beautiful new Rosary, repair a broken one, or purchase an inexpensive Rosary to keep in your pocket, your bag, or your desk.** Say a decade on the train, join us after the 5:10pm Mass, on Saturdays after the noon Mass, or make a schedule that works for you. You don't have to say five decades for it to be helpful.
- **Purchase your own copy of Stations of the Cross.** St. Agnes uses the very popular "Way of the Cross" by St. Alphonsus Liguori. Booklets are available in the bookstore. Join us on Fridays or practice on your own. The important thing is to make time and do it.
- **Start using holy water to bless yourself.** Keep it at home or in your bag. St. Agnes provides the water, which is blessed by one of our priests. Small bottles for holy water are available in the bookstore for a few dollars.

Sacred Relics Exposition and Presentation

**Tuesday, March 5, 2019
8:00 AM - 9:00 PM**

Over 150 Sacred relics will be on display at St. Helena Parish gymnasium on March 5th. There will be a public teaching about the Sacred Relics at 7:00 PM in the parish church. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will be here with a very special Vatican collection, some as old as 2000 years.

Among the treasures will be relics of St. Helena, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. In addition, there will also be present a portion of the veil of Our Lady, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic.

There is a special plenary indulgence attached to viewing this display. In the Church's history, many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. For more information, call the church at 718-892-3232.
