Dear Parishioner or Friend of Saint Agnes

Christmas is coming, and this year it will be unusual with all the restrictions and limitations on family gatherings and ways of worshipping Our Lord. Crazy as it all will be, I thought a way to make it crazier is to ask the faithful who know the Church of St. Agnes to come together and give the parish one million dollars. Yes, one million dollars, which is not much, considering the history of St. Agnes and all the good the parish has done since 1873.

My sister and brother-in-law invited me to their home on Lake George this past summer, and the ideas may have started when I visited the town of Lake George and saw the southernmost beach that is called “Million Dollar Beach.” Lake George is impressive, and the Beach was constructed in 1951 for a million dollars and continues to be an outstanding place to enjoy the lake to this day. Besides costing a million dollars, it offers a million-dollar view of beautiful Lake George with its stunningly clear water and will continue to do so for many decades to come.

With the COVID-19 crisis and the reduction in economic support along with the fact that St. Agnes has been operating at a deficit for years; one million dollars is not much and can help us get through the next two or three years. Then we may have to ask for another million dollars. But for now, I hope we can make it through the next few years during this time of crisis. Supporting the Church of St. Agnes is not just about getting through a tough time. It is also for the decades ahead in bringing the Catholic Faith to the public square of New York City.

Financial support can come through pledges over the next three to five years, putting St. Agnes in your Will, giving St. Agnes stock that has increased in value, setting up an Equity Fund. Of course, if it is possible, writing a check is the easiest way. Some of the faithful at St. Agnes could offer the parish a significant amount of money, and some can only offer a smaller amount. Many of you can give a significant amount. Either way, everyone who lives in the neighborhood and for the vast number who are commuters who work—or used to work—in Midtown Manhattan, will all benefit from being generous with a great parish where people can find and stay close to God.

Fr. Bob and I are giving \$70,000 to St. Agnes from money we each received from our mothers' legacies. It is not much, but it shows that we are committed to helping in any way we can. I invite all of you to think about ways to help St. Agnes overcome our economic struggle. If nothing else, Fr. Bob and I will not have to worry so much about paying the bills, which will add years to our life span!



Temporary Suspension of Limits on Charitable Contributions

In most cases, the amount of charitable contributions taxpayers can deduct on Schedule A of their taxes is limited to a percentage (usually 60 percent) of the taxpayer's adjusted gross income.

This year, for 2020, individuals may deduct qualified contributions of up to **100 percent** of their adjusted gross income.

To qualify, the contribution must be:

- made by check, cash, or credit card; online or by mail
- made payable to a qualifying organization; **Saint Agnes Church**
- made during the calendar year 2020

A corporation may deduct qualified contributions of up to 25 percent of its taxable income. Any contributions made by a corporation that exceed the 25% amount can carry over to the next tax year.

Seven Day Candles

You can purchase tall pillar candles at the rectory office or through the sacristan. These candles burn for approximately 7 days. Plain white candles are \$10/each. Memorial candles and candles with images (our Lord, the Blessed Mother and various Saints) are \$12 each or two for \$20.

We can also accept payment electronically (Zelle, Venmo) and place your candle in the church for you. See our website, stagneschurchnyc.org, for more details.

Solemnity of Christ the King

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. The feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI with the encyclical *Quas primas*. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of “anti-clericalism,” which seeks to extirpate Christian influence from political life. We see a version of anti-clericalism today, for example, when it is suggested that belief in Catholic teachings renders a person unfit for a judicial appointment. When our nation is beset by civic unrest, racial tension, and a pandemic, we do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over every people and nation.

Saint Clement of Rome

November 23th

In the revised New American Bible, Clement is listed as the fourth pope, serving 88-97. He is an important witness to the first century of the Catholic Church. Early Christian writers called him a disciple of the apostles, and he may be the Clement mentioned in St. Paul’s Letter to the Philippians (4:3). As bishop of Rome, Clement wrote an Epistle to the Corinthians that is believed to be the earliest surviving record of an intervention by Rome in the affairs of a local church. Whatever problems prompted the letter, Clement gently urges the Corinthians to reconcile and accept apostolic tradition. Some legends suggesting his martyrdom are discounted. He is the patron saint of marble-workers and stonecutters.

The Christmas Novena

November 30th is the feast day of St. Andrew the Apostle.

St. Andrew was the very first disciple called by Our Lord; his brother was St. Peter. The feast of St. Andrew marks the end of the liturgical year and the beginning of a new year with the start of Advent. In fact, the Sunday that falls nearest to St. Andrew’s feast day on November 30th is always the first Sunday of Advent. There are many traditions associated with St. Andrew’s feast day; beginning a Christmas novena is one of the most popular. The St. Andrew Christmas Novena, or more simply, The Christmas Novena, is a wonderful way to enter into the Advent season that is marked by a time of anticipation, penance, and prayer. This novena is prayed through all four weeks of Advent.

It is piously believed that whoever recites the St. Andrew Christmas Novena prayer FIFTEEN times each day from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30th) until Christmas Eve (December 24th) will obtain the favor requested.

St. Andrew Christmas Novena

Hail and blessed be the hour
and moment
in which the Son of God
was born
of the most pure Virgin Mary,
at midnight, in Bethlehem,
in the piercing cold.

In that hour, vouchsafe,
I beseech Thee, O my God,
to hear my prayer
and grant my desires
through the merits
of Our Savior,
Jesus Christ,
