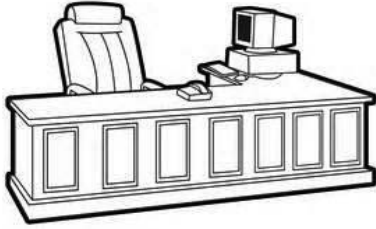

## **From Fr. JC Maximillian's Desk**

### **"Defining Moments" Week 5: Getting a Fresh Start by Breaking the Script"**

We continue with our message series, "Defining Moments." Moments matter because they come to stand for so much of how we view the world. Moments matter because they form a kind of lens through which we understand ourselves, our world, our place in the world, our relationships.

Moments matter, and some moments matter more. Defining Moments are brief experiences, so brimming with meaning that they bring definition and clarity into our lives that we did not previously have.

Two weeks ago we looked at the life of Samuel, who had to learn how to listen to the Lord to experience the defining moments God had in mind for him.

Last week, we looked at the story of Jonah, whose story dramatically teaches us that growth is outside our comfort zone. God shapes defining moments in which we are challenged to grow.

This week we are going to look at an experience that was a defining moment for a large group of people. They are going to hear Jesus preach, and recognize that he preaches with an authority that the Scribes and Pharisees do not have. They are going to witness Jesus cast out an unclean spirit, and in doing so they will recognize that Jesus was initiating a new day, and a new thing. Jesus could not only introduce them to new possibilities and new ways of living, he could provide the power to make it happen. Jesus was offering them a fresh start.

Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever. The same Lord who gave a fresh start to the man with an unclean spirit can give us a fresh start too. What is the new thing in 2021 that you would like the Lord to do in your life? Do you need to make a fresh start in your job? Maybe you need to renew the commitment to your marriage. Maybe you need to do something new with your finances. I do not know what you want God to make new for you in 2021, but I do know that God wants to do something new in your life.

For Jesus to do something new in your life, you have to take two steps. The first step is simply to name it; as clearly as you can. Then you need to begin a new spiritual practice. Jesus will provide the power but you have a part to play, you have to allow his power into your life.

We're already a month into 2021. The gyms are emptying out, diets are being deserted. New Years resolutions are melting away. But God still wants to do something new in your life this year. What is the new thing you need God's power to accomplish in 2021? Name it and take a spiritual action step this week. Don't wait.

A simple, small decision today could change the arc of the whole year ahead. It could even be your defining moment. And that would be amazing.

**ST. THOMAS AQUINAS**

We recently celebrated the feast of St. Thomas Aquinas on January 28<sup>th</sup> (Ordinary Form). His feast is celebrated March 7<sup>th</sup> in the Extraordinary Form. He was canonized on July 18, 1323 by Pope John XXII.

St. Thomas Aquinas was the greatest of the scholastic philosophers. He produced a comprehensive synthesis on Christian theology and Aristotelian philosophy (named after the philosophy Aristotle) that influenced Roman Catholic doctrine and how we interpret Divine Revelation for centuries. It was adopted as the official philosophy of the Church in 1917.

His most famous work was the Summa Theologiae. Amazingly, he wrote this as a summary of the faith for high school students. Today, theologians study St. Thomas Aquinas' Summa at the Master and Doctorate levels.

In the Summa, as it is called, Aquinas argues for the existence of God based on sense and empirical evidence. He defined God in 5 ways during this argument. God is the unmoved Mover, the First Cause, the Necessary Being, the Absolute Being and the Grand Designer. These arguments are still used today to prove the existence of God.

St. Thomas Aquinas is the patron saint of students, philosophers, publishers, booksellers, academics, theologians, apologists, universities and schools.

In his natural law theory Aquinas said, "Good is to be done and pursued and evil avoided." This simple statement can be recited daily by us as a reminder of how to live our day.

Here is a student's prayer to St. Thomas Aquinas:

**Come Holy Spirit, Divine Creator, true source of light and fountain of wisdom! Pour forth your brilliance upon my dense intellect, dissipate the darkness which covers me, that of sin and ignorance. Grant me a penetrating mind to understand, a retentive memory, method and ease in learning, the lucidity to comprehend, and abundant grace in expressing myself. Guide the beginning of my work. Direct its progress, and bring it to successful completion. This I ask through Jesus Christ, true God and true man, living and reigning with you and the Father forever and ever. Amen.**

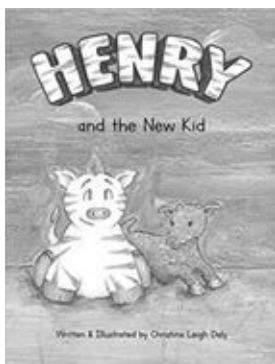
What do we want them to know? God uses defining moments to help us start fresh and new because God is the God of the fresh start.

## Diocesan Liturgical Directives for Upcoming Feasts and the Season of Lent

With the appearance of the COVID-19 vaccines, and at least glimpsing a light at the end of the tunnel for the pandemic, the Diocese issued some directives for the celebration of several upcoming liturgical feasts and for Lent.

First, there has been a revision to the ban on the distribution of printed materials, such as the bulletin. While the electronic version of the bulletin is preferred, we will be able to hand out bulletins AFTER Masses. They cannot be left on a table, as the virus can live on paper for up to 5 days, so the ushers will wear gloves and hand a bulletin to whomever wants one. We will only have 100 copies printed for now, so we still strongly encourage people to look at the bulletin online or sign up to have a PDF of it sent to you via Flocknote.

The Memorial of St. Blaise is February 3<sup>rd</sup>. There will be NO INDIVIDUAL blessings of throats since all physical contact is prohibited. Fr. JC will give a general blessing to the assembly at the end of the Mass.

One of the biggest changes is for Ash Wednesday, which is February 17 this year. First we need to remember that the Church as NEVER required attendance at Mass or the imposition of ashes on this day. For those who choose to come to Ash Wednesday this year, the imposing of ashes in the usual manner is forbidden. Basically two options have been offered. First, Pope Francis has extended the "Roman" custom of sprinkling the ashes on the top of the head to the universal Church. Bishop O'Connell recommends that we use a Q-tip to impose the ashes, was a new Q-tip being used for each person. This will require a person to stand next to the priest or deacon holding a container with the new Q-tips and a container for the used Q-tips (which will then be burned). After talking with several parishioners, the expressed preference is to use Q-tips, so we will need at least two volunteers at each Mass to assist. Also, while typically the ashes are blessed and distributed after the homily, this year they will only be imposed at the end of Mass with the people leaving as soon as they receive their ashes.

As for Stations of the Cross, the Diocesan directives says that the faithful must be masked, socially distanced, and remain in the pew. We will not be allow to hand out booklets, but if a person has their own they can bring it with them and then take it home afterwards. Fr. JC and the deacons still need to discuss this - mostly to see if the deacons are available to lead them, and if so if we can select just one version of the Stations, most like the one by St. Alphonsus Liguori, so that people can bring their own books. We will only hold the Stations at Holy Name Church so that we can live-stream them. Please keep in mind, for living streaming we only have a single, fixed camera focused on the Altar - so at home you will not be able to see the deacon moving from station to station.

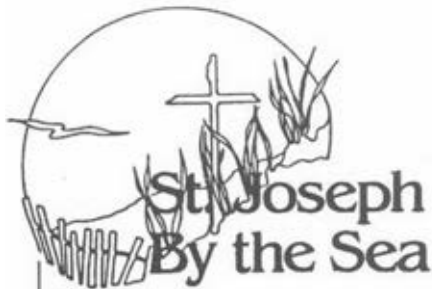
Finally for Palm Sunday; there will be no Procession or Solemn Entrance to begin Mass. The palms will be in vases in front of the Altar. Fr. JC will bless them during Mass, and at the end of Mass the ushers will carry these vases to the entrances of the church so that people can take some palm as they leave Mass.

# Resurrection Parish MASS BOOK -- 2021

**Making offerings for Masses in memory of deceased loved ones enjoys a long tradition in the Roman Catholic Church.**

## **The Mass Book for 2021 is now open**

*Hopefully, the following items will assist you in making your Mass offerings:*

### **How many Masses may I request?**

We ask you to limit your offering requests *initially* to four (4) Masses per family. This will help to ensure that all our parishioners have an opportunity to make Mass offerings for their deceased loved ones. In making your requests you might consider combining intentions. For example, rather than making a Mass offering for each of several members of the same family you might make an offering for one Mass in memory of all the deceased members of that family.

### **What is the expected Mass offering this year?**

Offerings given as alms for Mass intentions are used to support the daily needs of the clergy. Currently, the standard Mass stipend, or offering, in the Diocese of Trenton is \$10. Therefore, the standard Mass offering here at Resurrection Parish for all Masses is \$10, regardless of the day of the week that the Mass is offered.

### **How do I submit my Mass offerings?**

Please indicate your requests for Masses on the Request Form and return it, along with your offering, through the collection basket, the office mail slot, or by mail. Requests cannot be accepted over the phone. **Please carefully print all information.** **Your requests will be scheduled on a first come, first served basis.**

**When preparing your requests, please take note of the Mass schedule on various weekdays, weekends, feast days and holidays. Please use a 2021 calendar that indicates or includes the dates for civil holidays and special church feast days such as holy days of obligation.**

### **What happens if one of my requested Masses has already been taken by another request?**

If one of your requests cannot be fulfilled because that particular Mass has already been scheduled, then the parish staff will schedule as close to the date requested.

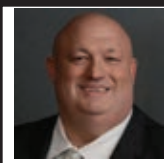
