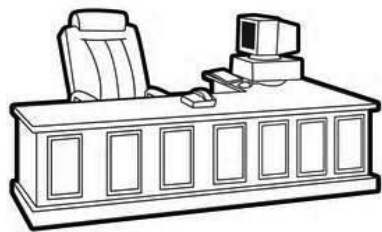

From Fr. JC Maximillian's Desk "Lent is Just Around the Corner"

Last weekend we finished our message series which began the New Year, "Defining Moments."

This weekend we have our Annual Catholic Appeal video. Our parish should be proud of itself, for ever since the

Annual Catholic Appeal (originally called the Bishop's Appeal) was instituted, through the generosity of the parishioners we have made our goal. The Annual Catholic Appeal only supports so many ministries and programs on the Diocesan level, but it also supports Resurrection Parish because when we reach our goal, we receive 15% back, and then 50% of anything over goal. This year our goal is again \$60,000, so if we reach it we will receive \$9,000.

Next weekend we will be beginning our next message series which is for the season of Lent, and is called, "No Offense." That means that Lent is just around the corner, in fact it begins this week with Ash Wednesday. So let's review some of the regulations for Lent that affects us, and some new directives due to the continuing pandemic.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Ash Wednesday has never been a holy day of obligation, so there is no requirement that Catholics receive ashes. However, it is a wonderful devotion to mark our entrance into a time of penance. We will be having two Masses on Wednesday; 9 AM at St. Casimir, and 7 PM at Holy Name. Due to the current health crisis, we are not permitted to touch anyone to impose ashes. After talking with the Pastoral Council, the deacons, and some other parishioners, we have decided that we will impose ashes using Q-Tips. At the end of Mass, after the final blessing, I will bless the ashes and say one of the formulas, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" or "You are dust and to dust you shall return," to everyone in general. The deacon and I will then stand in front of the altar with a bowl of blessed ashes. There will be someone standing next to us holding two bowls; one with new Q-Tips, and one for the used Q-Tips. Parishioners are invited to come forward to receive the ashes, which the minister will impose on the forehead with a new Q-Tip without saying anything. Once receiving ashes, parishioners are asked to leave the church immediately and return to their cars.

On Fridays during Lent we will be praying the Stations of the Cross. Both the State and the Diocese wants us to minimize public gatherings, so we will only be praying the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 3 PM in Holy Name Church. We are not permitted to hand out booklets to aid the parishioners in praying this devotion, but they are permitted to bring their own books with them. To make things easier, we will be praying the traditional Stations of the Cross by St. Alphonsus Ligouri - it is the most common version of the devotion, so most people should be able to find a copy of it, whether in a prayer book or on their smart phone. The congregation will not be allowed to follow the minister who is walking to each station; they must stay in their seat, wearing a face mask and remaining socially distant. The Diocese is also going to make a video of the Stations of the Cross and put it on their YouTube channel, and we will put a link to that video on our parish website.

ST. VALENTINE

St. Valentine, also known as St. Valentine of Rome was a widely recognized 3rd-century Roman saint. He is the saint of love, young people, happy marriages and also the saint of epilepsy whose feast day we celebrate today, February 14th. It's important to remember that today's feast is named after a saint and, as Christians we should call it Saint Valentine's Day not just the secularized version of Valentine's Day.

St. Valentine was a bishop and while some of the stories about him varied, one common story about him was that he was placed under house arrest with Judge Asterius. St. Valentine talked to the Judge about religion and faith. The judge put St. Valentine to the test. He told St. Valentine if he was able to heal his blind daughter then the judge would do anything for St. Valentine. Placing his hands over the blind girl's eyes, St. Valentine healed her.

The judge then broke all the idols around his house as St. Valentine commanded, fasted for 3 days and became baptized along with 44 members of his household (immediate and extended family).

St. Valentine was arrested again for trying to evangelize others and marrying Christian couples by the Emperor Claudius. Christians at that time were being persecuted by Claudius. While imprisoned, St. Valentine tried to convert Claudius to Christianity. Claudius became enraged and sentenced St. Valentine to death, commanding him to renounce his faith or be beaten by clubs and beheaded.

St. Valentine refused to renounce his faith and was executed and beheaded on February 14 th , 269 AD. On the day of his execution, he left a note for the judge's daughter signed "Your Valentine."

Archaeologists discovered St. Valentine's Roman catacomb and an ancient Church dedicated to St. Valentine. In 496 AD, Pope Gelasius marked February 14 th as a celebration in honor of his martyrdom.

Besides being the Saint of love, young people, happy marriages and epilepsy he is also the saint of engaged couples, bee keepers, fainting, greetings, plague and travelers. He is represented in pictures with birds and roses. The red rose represents deep love. Doves are a symbol of peace and love. Have a happy St. Valentine's Day.

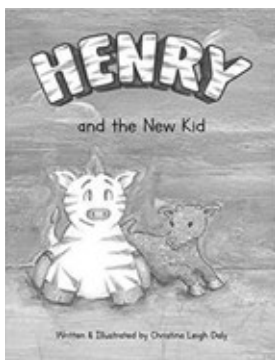

Diocesan Liturgical Directives for Upcoming Feasts and the Season of Lent

With the appearance of the COVID-19 vaccines, and at least glimpsing a light at the end of the tunnel for the pandemic, the Diocese issued some directives for the celebration of several upcoming liturgical feasts and for Lent.

First, there has been a revision to the ban on the distribution of printed materials, such as the bulletin. While the electronic version of the bulletin is preferred, we will be able to hand out bulletins AFTER Masses. They cannot be left on a table, as the virus can live on paper for up to 5 days, so the ushers will wear gloves and hand a bulletin to whomever wants one. We will only have 150 copies printed for now, so we still strongly encourage people to look at the bulletin online or sign up to have a PDF of it sent to you via Flocknote.



One of the biggest changes is for Ash Wednesday, which is February 17 this year. First we need to remember that the Church as NEVER required attendance at Mass or the imposition of ashes on this day. For those who choose to come to Ash Wednesday this year, the imposing of ashes in the usual manner is forbidden. Basically two options have been offered. First, Pope Francis has extended the "Roman" custom of sprinkling the ashes on the top of the head to the universal Church. Bishop O'Connell recommends that we use a Q-tip to impose the ashes, was a new Q-tip being used for each person. This will require a person to stand next to the priest or deacon holding a container with the new Q-tips and a container for the used Q-tips (which will then be burned). After talking with several parishioners, the expressed preference is to use Q-tips, so we will need at least two volunteers at each Mass to assist. Also, while typically the ashes are blessed and distributed after the homily, this year they will only be imposed at the end of Mass with the people leaving as soon as they receive their ashes.

As for Stations of the Cross, the Diocesan directives says that the faithful must be masked, socially distanced, and remain in the pew. We will not be allowed to hand out booklets, but if a person has their own they can bring it with them and then take it home afterwards. Fr. JC and the deacons still need to discuss this - mostly to see if the deacons are available to lead them, and if so if we can select just one version of the Stations, most like the one by St. Alphonsus Liguori, so that people can bring their own books. We will only hold the Stations at Holy Name Church so that we can live-stream them. Please keep in mind, for living streaming we only have a single, fixed camera focused on the Altar - so at home you will not be able to see the deacon moving from station to station.

Finally for Palm Sunday; there will be no Procession or Solemn Entrance to begin Mass. The palms will be in vases in front of the Altar. Fr. JC will bless them during Mass, and at the end of Mass the ushers will carry these vases to the entrances of the church so that people can take some palm as they leave Mass.

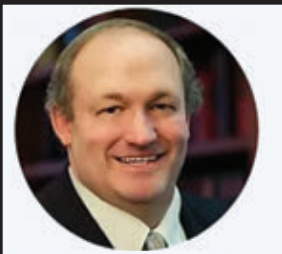
