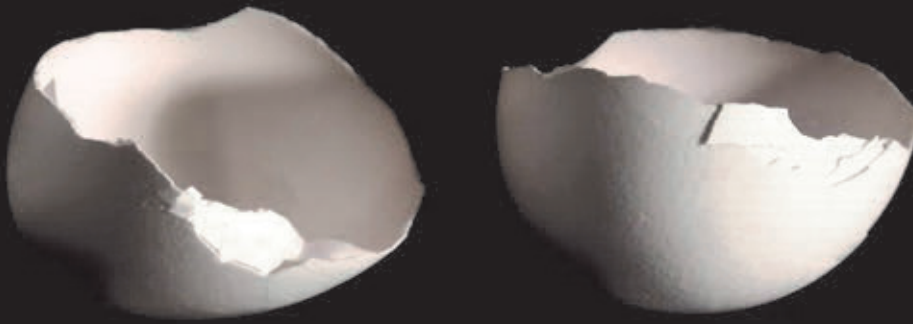

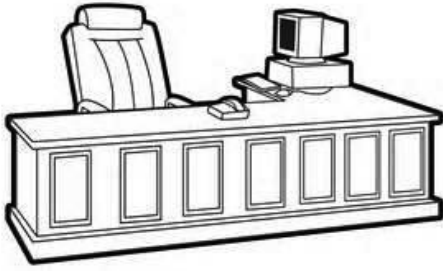

From Fr. JC Maximillian's Desk "No Offense" Week 2: "God has got your back"

Last week we started our message series for the season of Lent, which we are calling "No Offense." Last week we looked at a few basic facts about offenses.

First, offenses are inevitable. Life affords us opportunities to be offended in every way every day. Offenses can be perceived or real, intended or unintended. We cannot get by in life without experiencing offense nor can we get by without offending others.

Second, offenses are a trap. We can become so focused on something that offends us, that it keeps us from living up to our potential.

Lastly, we have a choice in how we handle offenses. It is up to us if we allow an offense to dwell in our heart. Even if one has gotten in there, we can still "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:15).

This week we want to look at a truth to hold onto when we are tempted to hold onto offense instead. It is a truth that can give us a more proper perspective on offenses so that we see them in the right context.

We are going to spend sometime this weekend looking at St. Paul's Letter to the Romans to discover this truth. St. Paul tells the Romans, and us, that in everything that happens to us, God works for good for those who love him. Clearly there is evil in the world. There are bad things that happen to all of us that are not a part of God's plan. To better understand this, we are going to look at the difference between God's *Perfect Will* and His *Permissive Will*. Basically it comes down to our free will.

So St. Paul isn't saying that everything that happens is good. But he is saying, that in every situation, good and bad, God is working on our behalf to bring about something good. Anyone can bring good out of good. God brings good out of evil. In every situation God is working to bring about goodness and growth in our character to help us "to be conformed to the image of his Son" (Romans 8:29). When it comes to an offense, maybe God has allowed it because he wants you to grow to be more like his Son.

Then St. Paul gets to the truth that is this week's main point, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31). If God is for us than people standing against us, or even working against us are ultimately of no consequence.

The next time you are offended by someone else and are tempted to take the offense into your heart or realize that you have harbored an offense, repeat that verse:

"If God is for me who can be against me."

Offenses never have to have the last word. Not when we've got God's word.

Sign of the Cross

The Sign of the Cross is a powerful prayer that should not be rushed or minimized. When we make the Sign of the Cross we pray that our whole lives, all that we do, we do in Jesus' name. Hence, every Sign of the Cross should be made with careful attention and reverence. Romano Guardini wrote: *"When we cross ourselves, let it be a real sign of the cross. Instead of a small cramped gesture that gives no notion of its meaning, let us make a large, unhurried sign, from forehead to breast, from shoulder to shoulder, consciously feeling how it includes the whole of us, our thoughts, our attitudes, our body and soul, how it consecrates and sanctifies us... Make a large cross, taking time thinking what you do. Let it take your whole being."*

The Sign of the Cross has two primary purposes:

1. To praise the Trinity when we say the words: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen
2. It reminds us that Jesus suffered and died for us when tracing the Cross on our bodies. Our obligation as his disciples is to take up our Cross and follow Him. In other words we are to be selfless and self-giving focused on the welfare of others rather than ourselves. This requires turning away from comforts and necessitates sacrifice and carrying our Cross.

Saints have recommended that we make the Sign of the Cross before opening our doors each day as a way of protecting us from evil influences in the outside world. They also recommend making the Sign of the Cross often throughout the day to worship the Trinity and protect ourselves.

Scriptural references to the Sign of the Cross include Ezekiel 9:4-6. The good people in Jerusalem received a sign on their foreheads which was the Hebrew letter *tahv*. This letter was in the shape of a cross. This spiritual mark was to set them apart from the rest of the corrupt culture and serve as divine protection.

Revelation 7:3 depicts the saints in heaven having a seal upon their foreheads and separates the righteous from the wicked and protects them from the coming judgement (Revelation 9:4). Everytime we trace the Sign of the Cross on our forehead we are expressing our desire to be set apart from the wicked world (power, pleasure, fame, wealth, comfort) and pursue a higher path to true happiness through sacrificial love. Also, we invoke God's protection on us from evil and temptation and seek God's help in the midst of trials and suffering.

It is a good practice for parents to exercise their priestly role in the family and trace the Sign of the Cross on the foreheads of their children and bless them each day. This powerful prayer can also be a good witness to others. At the end of Matthew's Gospel Jesus commands us to "Go out to all the world and spread the Good News." Simply making a large, slow, reverent Sign of the Cross in public (restaurants, in our cars, in stores, walking outside etc.) can powerfully exercise Jesus' command. So, encourage your family to embrace the powerful, yet simple prayer of reverently making the Sign of the Cross.

Diocesan Liturgical Directives for Upcoming Feasts and the Season of Lent

With the appearance of the COVID-19 vaccines, and at least glimpsing a light at the end of the tunnel for the pandemic, the Diocese issued some directives for the celebration of several upcoming liturgical feasts and for Lent.

First, there has been a revision to the ban on the distribution of printed materials, such as the bulletin. While the electronic version of the bulletin is preferred, we will be able to hand out bulletins AFTER Masses. They cannot be left on a table, as the virus can live on paper for up to 5 days, so the ushers will wear gloves and hand a bulletin to whomever wants one. We will only have 150 copies printed for now, so we still strongly encourage people to look at the bulletin online or sign up to have a PDF of it sent to you via Flocknote.

As for Stations of the Cross, the Diocesan directives says that the faithful must be masked, socially distanced, and remain in the pew. We will not be allowed to hand out booklets, but if a person has their own they can bring it with them and then take it home afterwards. Fr. JC and the deacons still need to discuss this – mostly to see if the deacons are available to lead them, and if so if we can select just one version of the Stations, most like the one by St. Alphonsus Liguori, so that people can bring their own books. We will only hold the Stations at Holy Name Church so that we can live-stream them. Please keep in mind, for living streaming we only have a single, fixed camera focused on the Altar – so at home you will not be able to see the deacon moving from station to station.

Finally for Palm Sunday; there will be no Procession or Solemn Entrance to begin Mass. The palms will be in vases in front of the Altar. Fr. JC will bless them during Mass, and at the end of Mass the ushers will carry these vases to the entrances of the church so that people can take some palm as they leave Mass.

Living in offense keeps us from living joyfully the life we want to live. To live the life God wants us to live we must learn to avoid the bait, the trap of being offended.

How many Masses may I request?

Currently, you may request as many Masses as you would like...you may use the form on the next page which provides for 4 Mass requests. If you would like more than the 4, please note them on an additional paper and attached them together.

What is the expected Mass offering this year?

Offerings given as alms for Mass intentions are used to support the daily needs of the clergy. Currently, the standard Mass stipend, or offering, in the Diocese of Trenton is \$10. Therefore, the standard Mass offering here at Resurrection Parish for all Masses is \$10, regardless of the day of the week that the Mass is offered.

How do I submit my Mass offerings?

Please indicate your requests for Masses on the Request Form and return it, along with your offering, through the collection basket, the office mail slot, or by mail. Requests cannot be accepted over the phone. **Please carefully print all information.** **Your requests will be scheduled on a first come, first served basis.**

When preparing your requests, please take note of the Mass schedule on various weekdays, weekends, feast days and holidays. Please use a 2021 calendar that indicates or includes the dates for civil holidays and special church feast days such as holy days of obligation.

What happens if one of my requested Masses has already been taken by another request?

If one of your requests cannot be fulfilled because that particular Mass has already been scheduled, then the parish staff will schedule as close to the date requested.
